Explains Operation and Purpose of H. P. Recreation Bureau

"The purpose of the Highland Park Service bureau is to serve the public at any time in any of their recreational activities," stated Harry L. Allen, director of the Community Recreation bureau at the Chamber of Commerce office.

"Serving the public includes the churches, fraternal organizations, the individual, and the schools. The Service bureau assists in organizing recreation programs and helps in putting on activities such as church so-

cial, picnics, and special celebrations. It is the place where people can get information on any phase; music, drama, social recreation, and athletics.

"The Community Service," continued Mr. Allen, "handles the indoor activities in the winter, early spring and late fall. The East Park board manages the work during the summer months and the remaining time."

Leaders will be appointed to supervise the various activities of the Park board. During the play ground season information on the picnic kits will be available. Athletics such as horseshoe pitching, volleyball, baseball, medicine ball, and quoits, will be practiced during the picnics.
