were twelve members present from the various parts of the county.

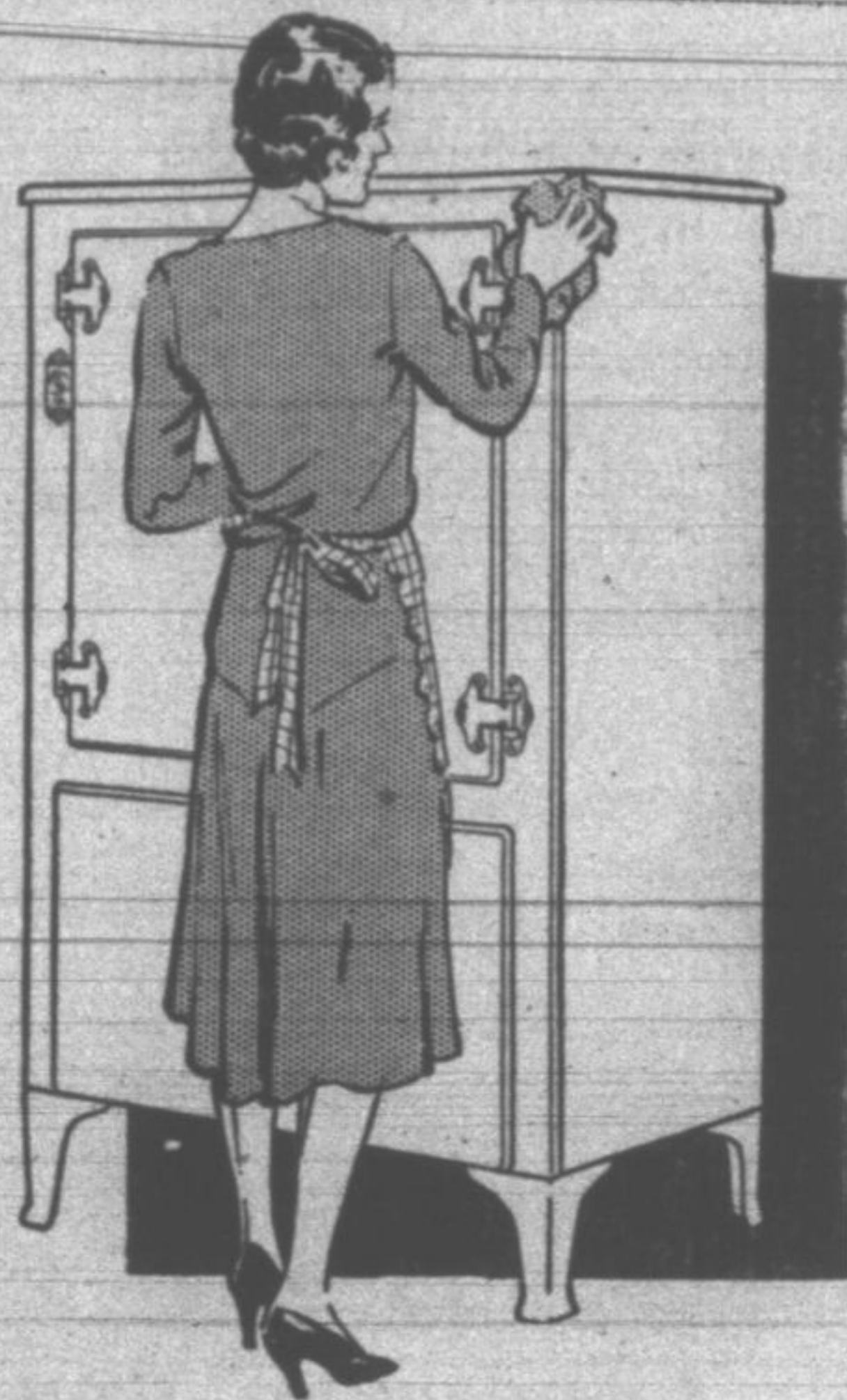
Benjamin White, who has spent the past year at the home of his mother, Mrs. Samuel Rockenbach, left last week for an indefinite stay in New York.
