

COUNTY BOARD NOW HAS 45 MEMBERS

Sixteen New Faces in Number to Meet April 23 for Organization

Now that the county board is increased to 45 members under the 1930 census, and with the town elections out of the way, the personnel of the new board shows 16 new faces with 11 of them being from Waukegan, two from Deerfield, two from Shields and one from Benton.

The board will meet to organize April 23, according to reports from Waukegan.

Twenty-nine of the membership are incumbents with 17 of that number being hold-overs, including four from Waukegan which now has a delegation of 16, with Deerfield (Highland Park and Highwood) ranking next in voting power with seven, Shields (Lake Forest, Lake Bluff and the south portion of North Chicago) third with five, Zion with two and Libertyville with two. The thirteen other towns have a supervisor each.

Four old members lost in the election. Supervisor Edward J. Monahan, Shields, was dropped, and Assistant Supervisor David A. Hutton, Daniel W. Short, and Fred Decker, all Waukegan, lost in the race.

"The main fruit area in Illinois begins in the vicinity of Centralia and extends southward to the Ohio river. Orchards just north of the river are in full bloom now. Those farther north will be blossoming between now and about April 18, when the buds will burst in the vicinity of Centralia.


