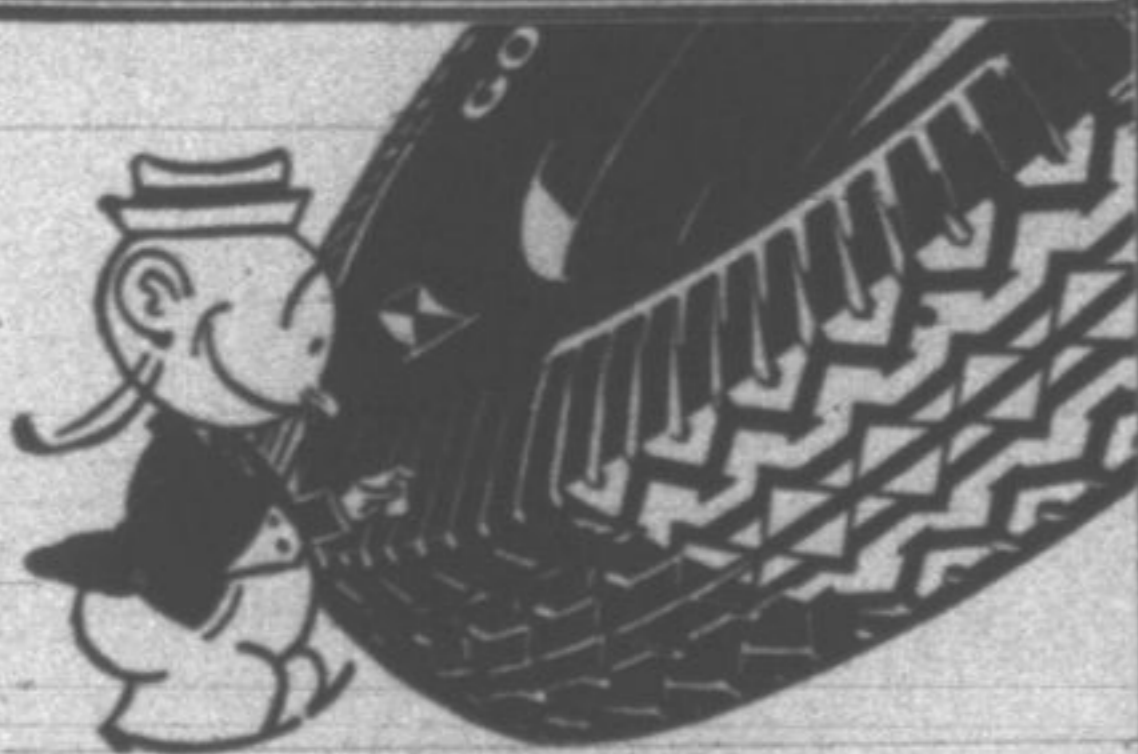

Uncle Sam Purchases Graham-Paige Fleet

The United States Bureau of Public Roads has purchased 64 new model six-cylinder commercial cars from the Graham-Paige Motors corporation for immediate delivery to the bureau's engineering corps, for use in government forest reservations and national parks throughout the west.

The new commercial vehicles are to be used in road surveying and reconnaissance work. Six have already been delivered at Ogden, Utah, for service in Arizona, Utah and Idaho. Another group of 28 will go to Fort Logan, Colorado, for the government road builders in New Mexico, Colorado and Wyoming. The remaining 30 will be shipped to Government Island, California, for use in California, Nevada, Oregon and Washington.

Specifications under which bids were submitted required that the vehicles be suitable for operation "over mountain trails and virgin terrain, mostly under capacity loads, where sturdiness, flexibility and dependability are the main requirements." It was further specified that the vehicles must be "capable of successfully withstanding the weaving action incidental to long trips over rough roads and trails."

The new vehicles have screen side bodies designed for carrying the engineering personnel with its equipment and supplies on reconnaissance and surveys.

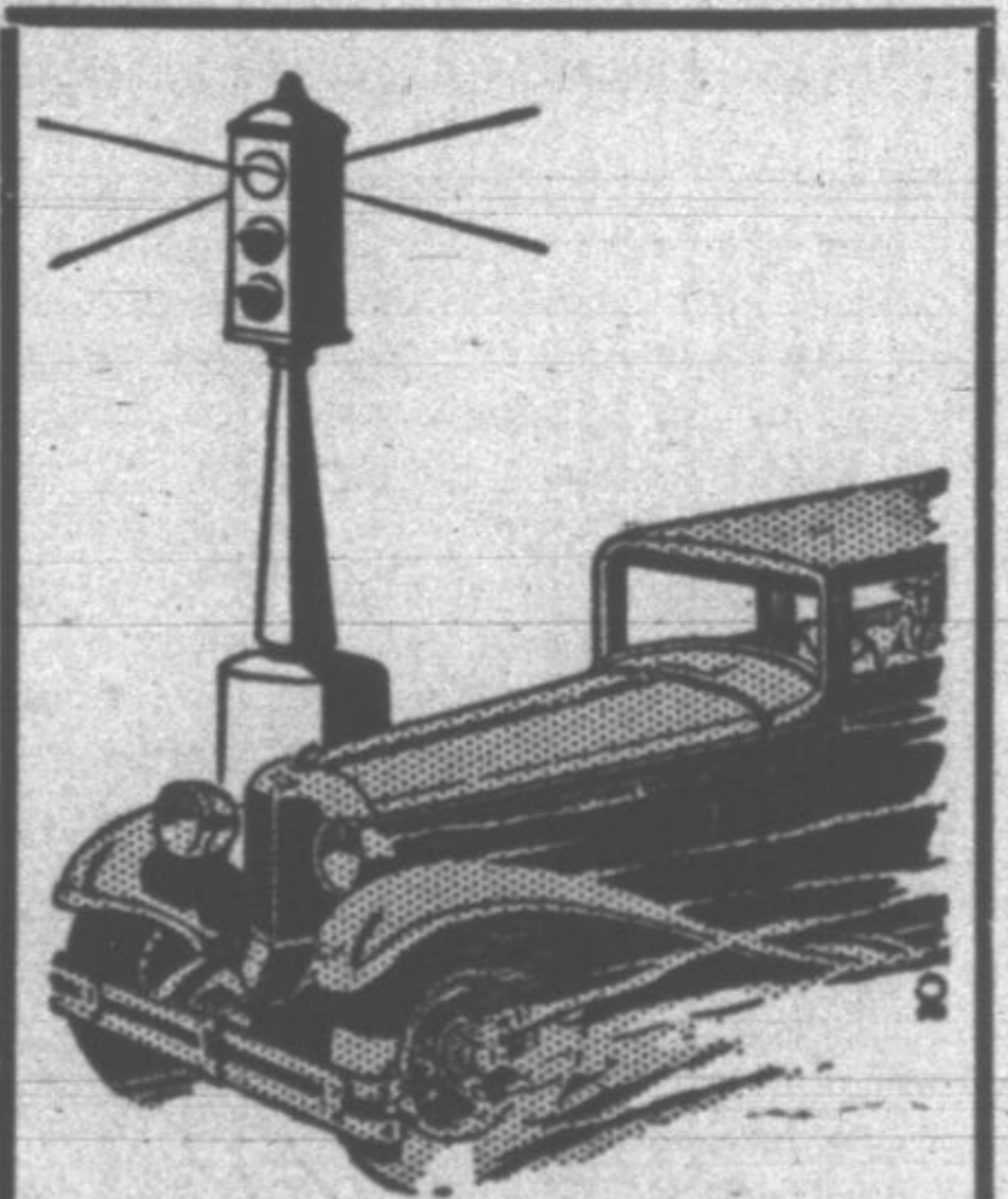
Girl Reserve News
