

Fire Chief Warns of Dangers Resulting from Many Grass Fire Alarms

The following warning from Fire Chief Hoskin regarding unreasonable demands upon the fire department is timely and may help to relieve the situation:

Warning to People

There is a limit to all things and the fire department is no exception. The department has at its command three pieces of apparatus and fourteen men. Can any one expect the department to answer six alarms at one time? This is the position the department was placed in on April 12.

Now visualize what could happen if a serious blaze should start while all apparatus and men were in different parts of our city extinguishing small grass fires. You people who start grass fires should consider the danger that you are subjecting others to. The danger to human life comes first and when the apparatus is called to extinguish these small grass fires there is the danger of wrecking the apparatus causing death or injury to the men. The apparatus costs money and if an accident takes place the department must operate without the use of the wrecked apparatus while it is under repair.

I am writing this letter with the hope that our citizens will see the danger to which they are exposing themselves and their neighbors and department by starting grass fires and leaving them unwatched. Always remember that a day with a strong wind blowing is a poor day to start a fire and also remember that your neighbor has just as much at stake as you have. And try to be fair. The department will bend every effort to carry out its duties to its citizens and asks that you assist them by carefulness on your part.
