

A Man of Integrity and Ability

METZEL for MAYOR

EMIL B. METZEL, candidate for Mayor of Highland Park at the Election next Tuesday, was born in Milwaukee sixty-four years ago and there received his education.

He moved to Chicago in 1887, organized the Cutler Shoe Company, a very successful business enterprise, which he owned and managed until 1925 when he retired from active work.

In 1908 he came to Highland Park. He built a residence at 273 Central avenue which he occupied until 1926. He now resides at 368 Woodland avenue, Ravinia, in his own home.

He was elected a member of the School Board of District 107 (Elm Place) and served continuously for ten years. During the major part of this time, he was its president. Under his guidance both the kindergarten school and the building to the north were constructed by a bond issue. Then, by public subscription \$50,000 was raised to build the auditorium.

The school attendance during these ten years doubled and there was considerable increase in operating expense. Yet, the record of those years is one of foresight and economic administration — a record which is a tribute to Mr. Metzels ability and one any man might well be proud of. We need just such a man at the head of Highland Park's city administration.
