Approve Committee's Plan for Remapping Congressional Dists.

Agreement on the proposal to re-map the congressional districts of Illinois as laid down three weeks ago last week were approved by the subcommittee on congressional reapportionments which would give 14 districts to the metropolitan area embracing Cook, Lake, Will and Dupage counties and 13 to the downstate.

The metropolitan districts would have an average population of 206,000 and the downstate 257,000 but the division has met with the approval of the subcommittee of which Rep. Sol. P. Dodernick, Chicago Republican, is chairman. The precise ratio if an accurate division were made, would be 282,000 residents per district and would give the metropolitan area one more.

Congressman Carl R. Chindbloom, Fred Britten, William Dietrich, Peter C. Granata, Harry P. Beam and Edward Kelly were present at the discussion.

Dietrich stated that he would retire, if deemed necessary to allow the reapportionment. He is a congressman-at-large and lives at Beardstown.

Lake county, which is in the 10th congressional district at present and has a little more than a third of the voting strength of the district which runs into the north side of Chicago, would have put few changes in its boundary lines under the change. Congressman Chindbloom, it is believed, will remain.
