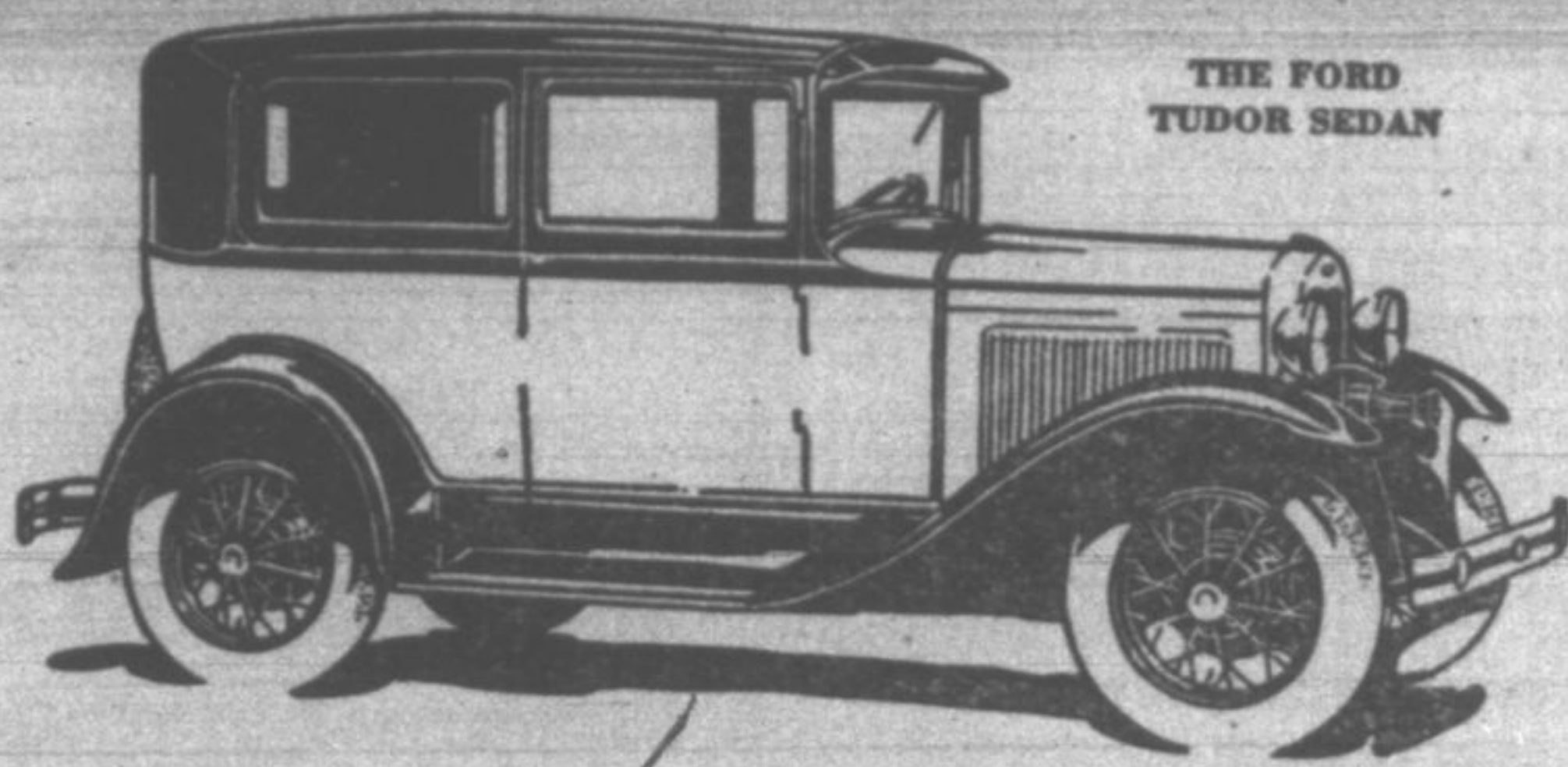

Urges Motorists to Be on Lookout for Children on Streets

Pointing out that six children from 3 to 14 years of age were killed in traffic accidents in Chicago and vicinity and many more in other sections of the country on the first day of early summer, the Chicago Motor club urged motorists to exercise additional caution in driving now that warm weather is here and children are more prone to play in the streets.

"The 'dangerous' age for children is between the ages of 4 and 8, inclusive," the motor club declared in a statement. "Out of 523 children up to 14 years of age killed in traffic accidents in Chicago during the past three years, more than one-half or 305, were in this 'dangerous' age. When a child reaches nine years, he or she has learned the fundamentals of caution on the streets, and is less likely to become involved in an accident.

"'Caution—School' signs take on added significance in early summer. The most dangerous hour of the twenty-four, from the standpoint of accidents to children, or after school hours, is between 4 and 5 p. m., when more accidents occur than during any other hour. More children are playing in the open then than at any other time.

Carp in Tons Seined From Lakes of County

Fifteen thousand pounds of carp, the coarse fish that destroy the game fish in the small lakes in Lake county, were seined out of Channel lake recently by state conservation men working under the direction of Deputy Game Warden Henry Kern.

The seiners also worked in Fox Lake and will make all of the lakes in the county before they are through.

Kern said that despite all the carp seined out of the lakes last year, this year's crop seems just as abundant as ever.

Governor Offers Prize For Public Schools in Business Education Line

"As in the past, the Red Cross was the organized Good Samaritan through which our more fortunate residents in Illinois and elsewhere made their contributions to help the needy. Working through and with the Red Cross, in our own state, were other organizations and associations, whose combined efforts achieved splendid results.

"The people of Illinois have reason to be thankful for the service performed by this splendid organization in our state. Immediately following the tri-state tornado in 1925, the Red Cross went into the stricken area and administered relief. Again it speedily came to the assistance of our people when Illinois was visited by disastrous and destructive floods.

"You may be assured that our citizens will never forget the immediate response and generosity of the Red Cross in times of suffering and disaster."
