



The resurfacing of the Roosevelt road between DeKalb and the Ogle county line, 7.52 miles, and on the Lincoln highway, Chicago Heights to the Cook county line, 5.24 miles, and on Route No. 20, Volo to Grayslake, 6.32 miles. Contracts for the resurfacing on the Roosevelt road and on Route No. 20 were reported let last week.
