## Camp Fees Lower; More Scouts to Go

The 12-day periods, the shorter train trip with reduced fee, and "bargain" first period will permit a boy to go to camp considerably cheaper than last year. These are some of the reasons why many more boys will be at Ma-Ka-Ja-Wan this year than last. The fees are as follows:

**Camp Fees for Scouts Registering a Single Period (Board Only)**  
 1st period, \$11; 2nd period, \$12; 3rd period, \$12; 4th period, \$12.  
 \$20 per Scout will be charged for each succeeding period a Scout remains in camp.

**Transportation Rates (Round Trip)**  
 The Chicago and North Western railroad has made the following rates:

Tickets for two week period	\$ 8.88
Tickets for four week period	11.84
Tickets for six or eight week periods	14.24
One way ticket to or from Antigo	8.88

The above rates show that a boy can have the privilege of camp life as cheap as \$11 where the transportation is furnished by the troop committee. Registrations are coming in fast and each period will be closed to further scouts as soon as it is registered to capacity. That means clip the registration form below and mail now.

## Here Is Your Equipment Check List

- It is **essential** that you bring—
- 4 Woolen blankets or equivalent. (Be sure to bring plenty—it gets cold at night.)
  - 2 Extra shirts, suitable for outdoor wear.
  - 1 Extra pair shorts
  - 1 Extra pair trousers or breeches.
  - 1 Heavy Sweater or lumberjack.
  - 1 Poncho or raincoat.
  - 1 Change of underwear.
  - 1 Extra pair strong shoes (not tennis slippers).
  - 4 Pairs stockings (preferably wool).
- It is **desirable** that you bring—
- Flashlight.
  - Compass.
  - Musical instrument.
  - Camera.
  - Field glasses.
  - Signal flags.
  - Sewing kit.
  - Scout Rope.
- The above list is adequate for two weeks or eight weeks. There is ample opportunity doing your own laundry or getting it done. Baggage should consist of one large suitcase and blanket roll. No responsibility is accepted for possible loss of equipment. On arrival at camp each Scout is furnished with a locker box for his equipment and his suitcase is safely stored until the return trip.

The all night train trip of last year has been eliminated. Getting an early Monday morning start the scouts get in camp shortly after noon, in time for lunch. The time schedule is as follows:  
 A special car leaves Highland Park for camp early on Monday morning at 3:20, arriving at Antigo at 1:10 p. m. On return trip the group leaves Antigo at 12:40 p. m. and arrives in Highland Park at 9:32 p. m. The above is all daylight savings time.
