PLANT FOODS AND THEIR FUNCTIONS

Of the many mineral elements required by plants for proper growth and development, there are three which are most important—nitrogen phosphorus and potassium. One or more of these plant foods are lacking in nearly all soils — that is, in sufficient quantities and in available form for plants to use them freely.

Nitrogen gives to the foliage the healthful rich green color characteristic of vigorous growth. It causes the stooling and spreading of grasses and the proper development of growth to all vegetation. It is the "advertising agent" in fertilizers be-

cause its results can be readily seen. Lawn and garden crops need an abundant supply of nitrogen.

Phosphorus has a direct bearing on reproduction. It is vital in the development of root structure and normal growth. It increases the number and size of the blooms and controls the time of maturity of the plants.

Potash favors starch formation and aids in making heavy perfect blooms in root development and is especially important for bulbs and tubers. Potash stiffens the stems of grasses and flowers and keeps the plant healthy, strong and disease re-
