

In the perennial border, too, there are early arrivals that help to make the garden's spring gown a lovely one. Columbines are never so attractive as when planted among Iris. Their airy little blooms flutter in saucy contrast to the military erectness of the Iris.

Then too, the biennials that need renewing every year or so may have caused bare places in the border that are quite evident now that growth has started. New varieties should be planted so that all vacant spaces will be eliminated before summer comes.

sistant. Grasses, flowers and many vegetables require large amounts of potash to give them firmness and bring out fullness of color.

GETTING PLANT FOOD TO THE ROOTS

It is necessary to thoroughly water in plant foods on established turf with a heavy drenching in order to carry them to the roots as well as to wash them from the foliage where

if left, they will be harmful and of no value.

All concentrated plant foods if left on the foliage, will be harmful. For best results use plenty of water immediately after applying.

Grass Lake Lotus Beds Soon in Bloom, Report

The Grass Lake lotus beds, famous throughout North America for their beauty and reality, will be more beau-
