IN ROAD BUILDING

Contracts Awarded Throughout U. S. Exceed Previous Mark Already, Report

With long term state and municipal 67.20 bond issues and concrete surface 23.93 pavement awards setting new high records during March, fulfillment of 85.25 their earliest prediction that highway 94.50 and public works construction are in for a banner year is foreseen by the 78.00 Associated General Contractors of America.

An analysis of construction trends 104.00 just completed by the association 78.00 shows that state and muncipal bond 78.00 issues for March were larger than for 104.00 any other month on record, with the 500.00 exception of the peak month of Dedcember, 1929. The March issues totalled \$275,000,000, according to pre-150.00 liminary figures compiled by The Bond Buyer, and averaged \$148,006,-000 per month for the first quarter of 11.30 the year.

Break Records

Concrete surface pavement awards during March broke all previous records for the month and have been exceeded only twice before during any month on record, the analysis 5.00 reveals. Although the awards for 5.00 streets and alleys have been below 5.00 average, the total for road work dur-112.00 ing the first three months of 1931 has been unprecedented, never before having been equalled in comparable periods.

The total awards for March accord-150.00 ing to figures compiled by the Portland Cement association, were 19,466,-6.15 568 square yards, or an increase of 45 120.00 per cent over those of March a year 104.00 ago, while the total for the first three 84.00 months was 38,976,870 square yards, 30.00 or an increase of 43 per cent. The 4.75 March awards, which practically equalled the combined total of the first two months, have been exceeded only by those for the months of May 78.00 1928, and 1929 and in neither of those months were the road totals so large.


Petitioners Must Talk to Committees of Board
