D. A. R. Better Films Committee Review

The best of news for the children this week! Just the kind of a picture for junior matinees has been secured for next Saturday, and all the family will enjoy "Rango." It is an authentic study of jungle life in Sumatra (look it up in your geographies first, children) contrasting the actions and emotions of a native and his son with those of an Orang-Outang and his rascally little son, Rango. The antics of this lovable little fellow will delight you all. Remarkable photography revealing the spirit of the jungle, plus suspense without sensationalism, intensifies the educational value of this film and makes it highly recommended.

Another good family picture is "The Conquering Horde" This is a Western story with a historical background. Post civil war period, political intrigue, delightful romance, little humor but a creditable entertainment for all. Richard Arlen has the lead.

"Unfaithful" Admirers of Ruth Chatterton will be disappointed in this vehicle which is unworthy of her. It is the story of a woman's self-sacrifice and loss of reputation, to prevent her adored brother from learning his wife's infidelities. Her charm and a clever cast fail to redeem it. Not recommended.

"Millie" Helen Twelvetrees gives an excellent interpretation of the role of 'Millie,' a girl with a high ideal of marriage. Disillusionment follows, degradation and embitterment. Not recommended because of lapses from good taste and lack of moral values. Adults only.

Poppy Is Memorial Flower of Auxiliary

In the spring of 1919 after the war, on Flanders Field, where the firing had been terrific and thousands of soldiers had fallen in battle, in the midst of complete devastation, the poppies came up in abundance. The French women tell you today that the poppy is significant of the sacrificial blood of the boys who fell on Flanders Fields. Those who have traveled through France since the war, tell us it is peculiarly true, that where the battle was the fiercest and the bloodshed the greatest, the poppies to this day grow most profuse.

From this superstition comes the true message of the poppy—the message from the boys who fell, as expressed most beautifully in Col. John McRae's verse (We Shall Not Sleep:)

"In Flanders Field the poppies blow
Between the crosses, row on row
That mark our place; and in the sky
The larks still bravely singing fly,
Scarce heard amidst the guns below.

"We are the dead.
Short days ago we lived, felt dawn,
Saw sunset glow
Loved and were loved, and now we lie
In Flanders Field.

"Take up your quarrel with the foe.
To you from failing hands we throw
The Torch—be yours to hold it high;
If ye break faith with those who die,
We shall not sleep, though poppies grow
In Flanders Field."

Because of this close association to the supreme sacrifice made by the boys who fell in France, the poppy has become the Memorial Flower of The American Legion and Auxiliary—the emblem of a faith that is being kept through service to the living.—Highwood.

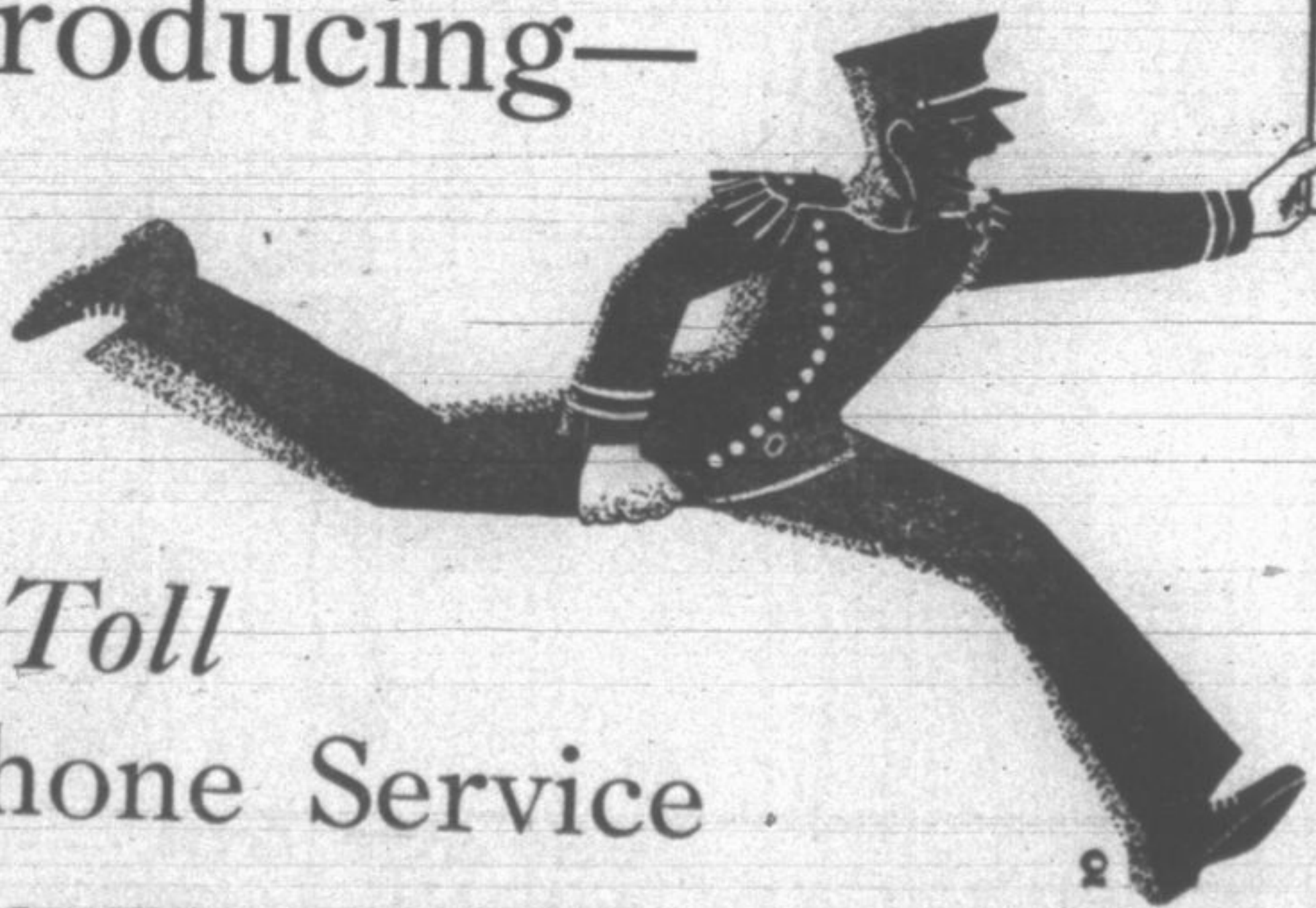
Pi Delta Club to Hold Card Party

High Court Reverses Ruling in Sears Case

According to a decision handed down last week by the state supreme court, Mrs. Anna Sears, widow of Richard W. Sears, is not liable for the \$1,700,000 taxes on his personal property, reversing the Lake county circuit court. At the time of Sears' death in 1914 the statutes made no provisions for assessment after his death of property which had been omitted from assessment in his lifetime, the court held. Notice of appeal for a rehearing was filed by the state.
