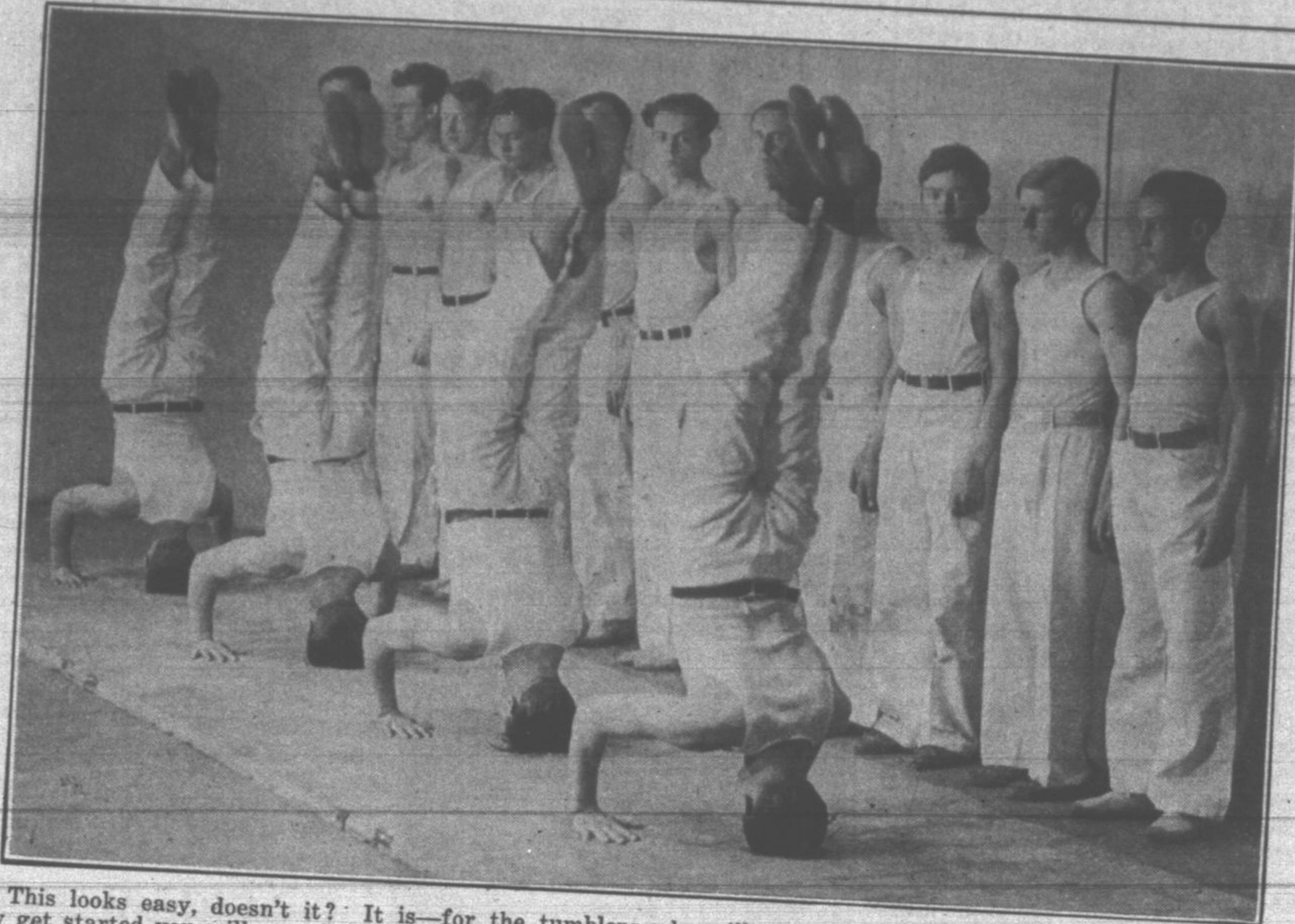


HIGH SCHOOL TUMBLERS IN STUDENT STUNTS

Hold Nevitt to Grand Jury; Bond of \$20,000

Herbert Nevitt, auto dealer, who was picked up as a suspicious character by Winnetka police last Sunday and has been sought for the past month by Highland Park police, was arraigned before Judge Herman Schwery and bound over to the grand jury and held on \$20,000 bonds.

Nevitt was charged with financing automobiles, changing their serial numbers, and refinancing them. His alleged illegal acts were disclosed when two financing companies sued to recover an automobile. Among the complaints were that of the Highland State bank, Standard Motor Securities company of Evanston, both of which financed auto sales made by Nevitt Motor Sales company, Highland Park.

This alleged falsifying of his reports is thought to have netted him between \$25,000 and \$30,000, the police report.
