Deerfield-Shields School Enrollment Is 1,312 at Present

According to some statistics compiled recently by Mr. Pertz, the high total of enrollment to date, in Deerfield-Shields, is 1312 students.

Out of the total number there are 672 boys, 640 girls, 12 apprentices, leaving 1300 students in the school proper.
