Did you know that the following wild flowers should not be picked: Showy Orchid, Indian Painted Cup, Ladies' Slipper and Columbine? Did you know that only one or two of these should be picked: Bishop's Cup, Blood-root, Bluebells (Mertensia Virginica), White Baneberry, Blue-eyed Mary (Innocence), White Trillium, Jack-in-the-pulpit, and yellow Adder's Tongue? The following are more abundant than those just named, but some restraint should be used in picking the Hepatica, Rue Anemone, Pepper Root, Purple Spring Cress, Phlox, Marsh Marigold, Wood Anemone, Wild Geranium, Jacob's Ladder (Blue-bells).

How Your Library Reaches Highland Park

5,098 residents or over 49 per cent of the population have library cards.
23,234 volumes in the library.
100,662 books borrowed last year, making a circulation of 8.5 books per capita.

Sales of A. & P. Stores for 4 Weeks to April 25 Totaled \$85,160,278.00

Sales of The Great Atlantic & Pacific Tea company for the four week period ending April 25th were \$85,160,278. This compares with \$86,137,293 for the same period in 1930, and is a decrease of \$977,015, or 1.13 per cent.

More goods were sold during the April period in 1931 than in the same period a year ago, as shown in the estimated tonnage figures. April sales, expressed in tons, were 454,479 this year, compared with 399,211 in April, 1930. This is a gain in quantity of merchandise sold of 55,268 tons, or 13.84 per cent.

Average weekly sales in April were \$21,290,070, compared with \$21,534,323 in 1930, a decrease of \$244,254. Average weekly tonnage sales were 113,620 compared with 99,803 in April, 1930, an increase of 13,817.
