"Kismet" is the screen performance of Otis Skinner's famous play of that name. He gives a splendid performance and sets, costumes, and pageantry make this an unusual spectacle. It will have little interest for the very young.

"The Hot Heiress" Ben Lyon a humble hero weds a rich heiress, Ona Munson. It is lively and amusing has some good songs and is harmless if not extremely convincing. Family.

"It's a Wise Child" Although this is exceedingly funny and very well acted it is a transgression from good taste; and disrespect for law, and inexcusable vulgarities make it impossible to recommend it.
