### Barnes Building Being Remodelled; Third Floor to Be Removed Entirely

The building at Second and Central, owned by J. M. Barnes and occupied by the Meierhoff Hardware Co., is being remodeled into a modern two-story store and office building, with offices on the second floor. The third story is to be removed entirely. The building was erected in 1882 by former Mayor R. G. Evans. In 1884 the third story was added to make a dance hall. In 1920 the third story was condemned as a fire trap and has not been since used. The entire interior will be redecorated when the building alterations are completed.
