## BRIEF NEWS ITEMS

Happenings About This Part of North Shore; Doings at County Seat

Plans for a big pageant that will mark the third day of the proposed Lake County Trade Jubilee Week, on May 25 to 29 inclusive were being formulated by a special committee of the organization today.

The village of Barrington will spend more than \$5,000 shortly in building a fireproof addition to the present village jail, which has been the subject of several complaints by residents.

Street cars will operate on the County street section of the new loop in the business section of Waukegan by June 1, George Kenry, division superintendent of the North Shore line, stated last week.

Walter H. Nibbelink, who has served as building commissioner for four years in Waukegan and who prior to that period held the position of city building inspector, tendered his resignation.




