# April Levels of Lakes Lower, Statistics Show

A fall of .07 of a foot from the March level of Lake Michigan and Lake Huron, was recorded for April of this year in the books of the United States lake survey, where reports of dropping or rising in water levels are entered.

The survey showed Lake Superior lowered .16 of a foot in April. Lakes Erie and Ontario were .31 of a foot and .3 of a foot higher in April, respectively.

Lakes Michigan and Huron, the survey showed, were 1.77 feet lower than below the average April level for 10
