If your car should be burned or stolen, will your insurance company pay you the amount stated in the policy? The amount named in the policy is a valuation used to determine the cost of the insurance, the rate for fire and theft insurance being a certain price per hundred dollars of valuation.

The policy says that in the event of a total loss you will receive an amount not to exceed the actual loss sustained, the settlement to be agreed upon by you and the adjuster for the insurance company. This is the policy known as the "non valued" form.

Then there is the "valued form" policy. Under the terms of this policy you are paid the face value of the policy, the amount on which you have paid premium.
