Redmond Property Sold to F. D. Sadler

Property which has been in the Redmond family since 1850 has been sold to Fred D. Sadler, senior partner of the Chicago Stock Exchange firm of F. S. Sadler & Co. Mr. Sadler bought Tollhurst three years ago. The 200 acres of Tollhurst and the 107 acres purchased last week were bought by Michael Redmond for \$265 in 1850. The first owner of the property was Patrick Dorson of Chicago who bought it in 1846. The 307 acres of land lie west of Lake Forest on Conway road. An artificial lake of approximately 15 acres may be constructed and the property sold in 5 or 10 acre estates.
