AN ORDINANCE
BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF
THE HIGHLAND PARK MOSQUITO
ABATEMENT DISTRICT APPROPRIATING MONEY FOR ITS CORPORATE PURPOSES TO BE EXPENDED DURING THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING MAY 14, 1932.
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE HIGHLAND PARK

MOSQUITO ABATEMENT DISTRICT:
Section 1. That the following amounts, or so much thereof as may be authorized by law and as may be needed, be and the same are hereby appropriated for the corporate purposes of the Highland Park Mosquito Abatement District as hereinafter specified for the fiscal year ending May 14, 1932:

For purchase of field equipment	\$2500.00
For office supplies and expenses	100.00
For field salaries and wages	7000.00
For the cost of the organization of district	1200.00
For publication expense	100.00
For legal expenses	500.00
For contingencies	1000.00

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and due publication.

estimated. A truck or two and knapsack sprayers will be used. Two full-time men as inspector and foreman will be employed and two gangs of four men each will be operated. It is planned to start active work by the middle of June and continue until the first frost.

Ravinia Park Aiding
Work of the district will be greatly simplified by the full co-operation of Ravinia Park authorities. As in the past the district from Roger Williams avenue in Highland Park south to the county line and from the lake west to the Skokie ditch will be tended by crews from the opera park.

Mayor E. B. Metzger of Highland Park has offered his co-operation and it is probable that equipment will be stored at the city yards.

All members of the board will make a trip over the district to acquaint themselves with local conditions. Practically all of Deerfield Township is included and the communities of Highland Park, Highwood, Deerfield and Bannockburn. An assessed valuation of \$20,000,000 will be taxed at the rate of one-half mill on an estimated income of \$10,000 annually.
