Week-end guests at the home of Mr. and Mrs. William Plagge were

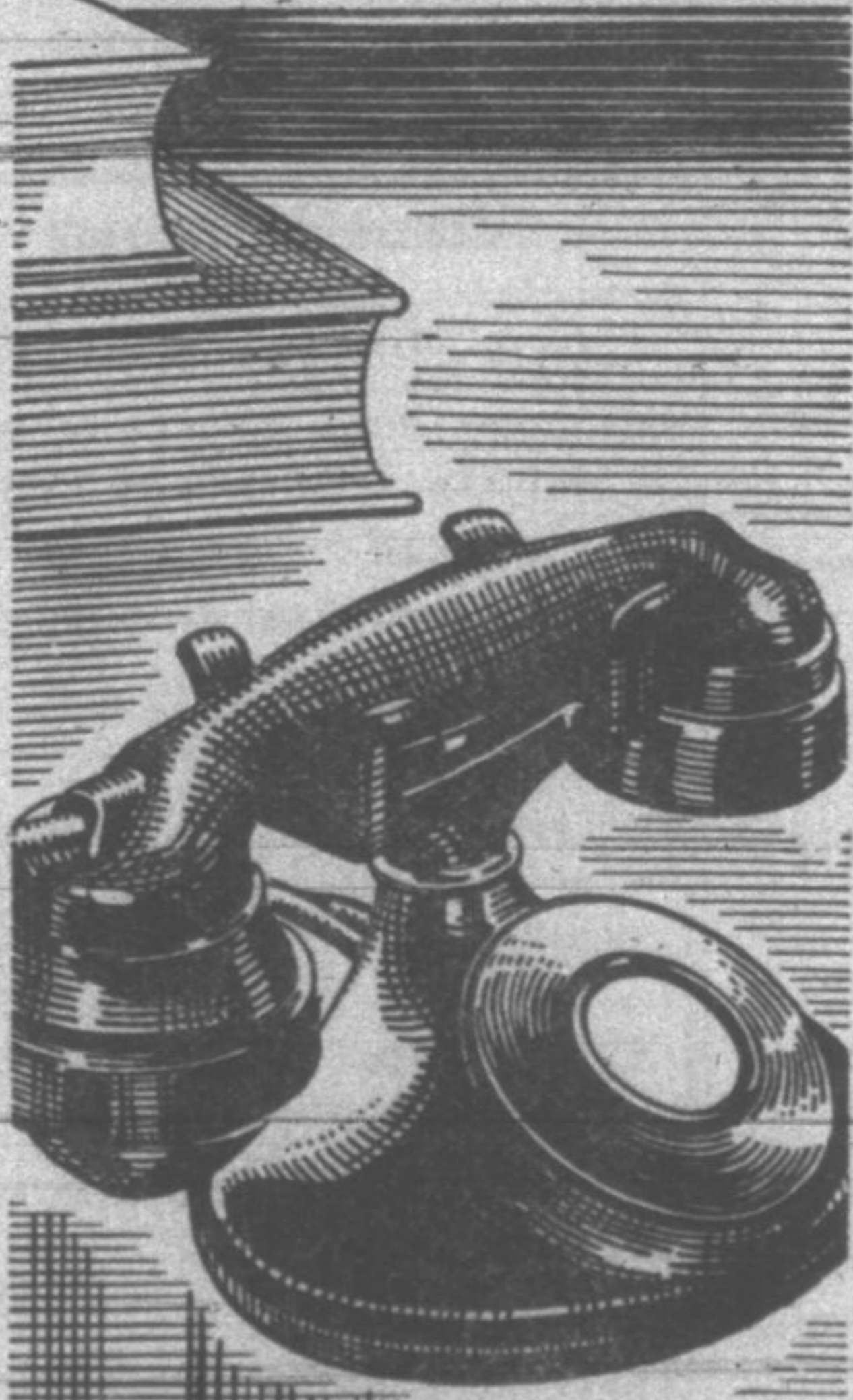
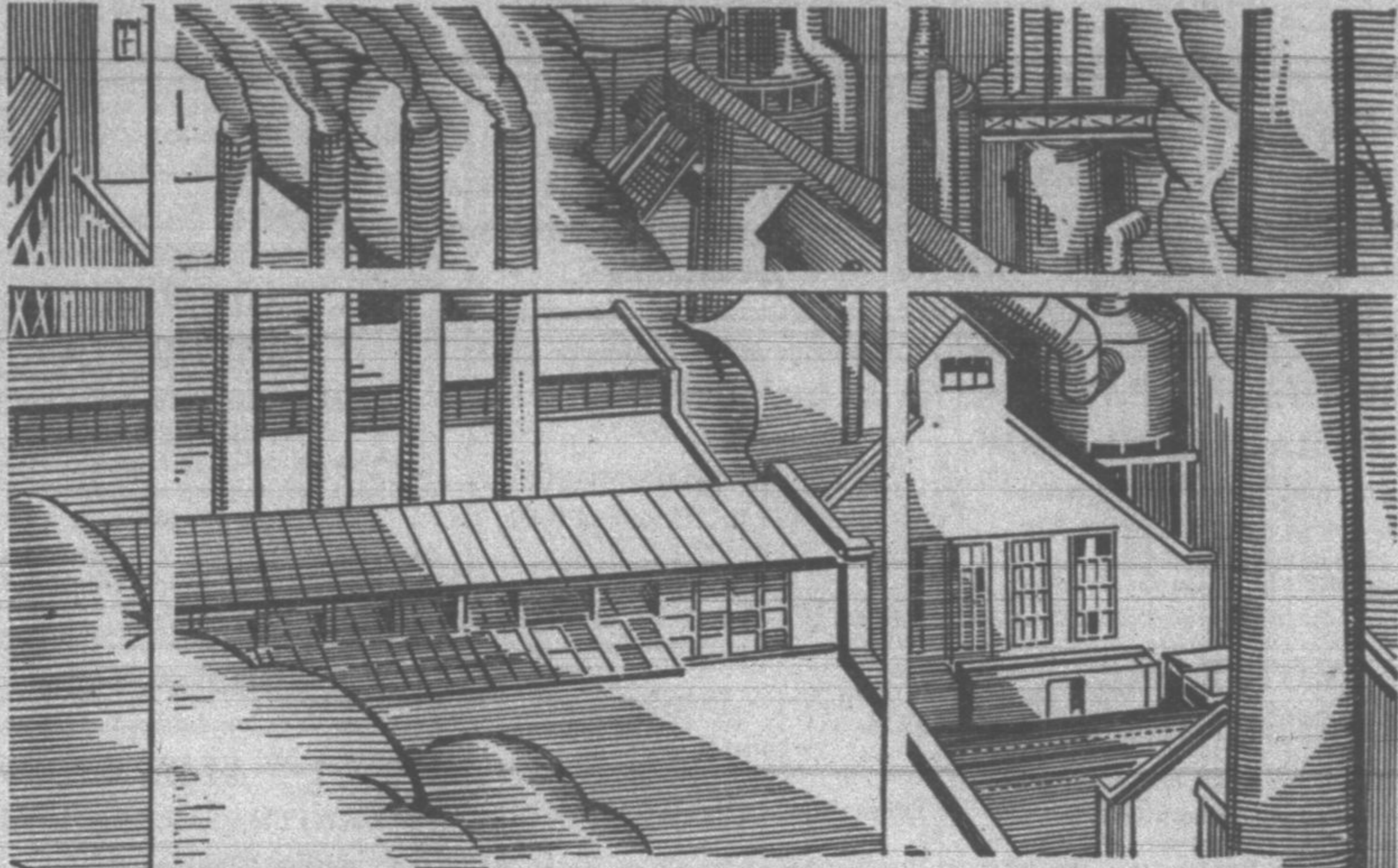
their little granddaughter Marilyn Gayne of Chicago and Mr. and Mrs. Auston Plagge and daughter Lorraine of Maywood.
