Summer school at Deerfield-Shields will open Monday, June 22, and will continue until August 14. The hours will be from 8 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Review work can be carried in as many as three subjects.

The subjects offered are English, one to six; history one, two, eight, eleven, and twelve; band, orchestra; typewriting two, three, four; Latin two, three, four; swimming, which may be a part of regular gym work; and mathematics, one to four.

Mr. Mason and Miss Bredin will teach English. History will be taught by Mr. Slocum. Mr. Finch will teach band and orchestra, and Mr. Wright and Mr. Eiker will teach mathematics.

Mechanical drawing and manual training are being taught by Mr. Pertz and Mr. Schneider.
