

Dominating the picture are the common type of duckbilled dinosaurs, while not far off are seen other duckbills of different species, known as hooded and crested dinosaurs. A little farther off appear the slender bird-like dinosaurs, resembling ostriches in appearance.

These dinosaurs ranged in size from that of a large crocodile to that of an elephant, states Prof. Elmer S. Riggs, associate curator of paleontology. They flourished in North America at a period when the great planes area had recently been raised above the sea, when the Rocky mountains were new, and when the whole continent enjoyed a semi-tropical climate. Their characteristics have been learned from fossil remains which have been found from Colorado to Alberta.
