

## Does Your Automobile Insurance Policy Say What You Think It Does?

If your car should be burned or stolen, will your insurance company pay you the amount stated in the policy? The amount named in the policy is a valuation used to determine the cost of the insurance, the rate for fire and theft insurance being a certain price per hundred dollars of valuation.

The policy says that in the event of a total loss you will receive an amount not to exceed the actual loss sustained, the settlement to be agreed upon by you and the adjuster for the insurance company. This is the policy known as the "non valued" form.

Then there is the "valued form" policy. Under the terms of this policy you are paid the face value of the policy, the amount on which you have paid premium.

### Marshall Fields Give Four Lions to Field Museum; Fine Specimens

From Mr. and Mrs. Marshall Field of New York gifts have been received at Field Museum of Natural History of four specimens of lions which they shot in Africa, and several thousand feet of motion picture film depicting wild life of that continent, it was announced today by Stephen C. Simms, director of the museum.

The films, which were made by Mrs. Field, contain especially good views of groups of lions amid rock dens as well as in the open. An unusual and most interesting bit of motion photography was achieved by Mrs. Field in filming two cheetahs in action, these being among the most difficult of all animals to photograph because they rank with the fleetest of mammals.

The films and specimens result from the recent hunting trip of Mr. and Mrs. Field in Tanganyika Territory, British East Africa. Included among the lions are a large full grown male, a female, and two cubs. The male is between nine and ten feet long, which is almost the maximum size attained by lions. It is heavily maned.

The lion specimens are to be used in the preparation of a habitat group which has long been desired for addition to the museum's African exhibits, according to Dr. Wilfred H. Osgood, curator of zoology.

### Plan Expenditure of Huge Sum for Hotels

New hotel construction and remodeling in America during 1931 will approximate \$325,000,000 according to a hotel survey conducted by the Indiana Limestone company.

"This 1931 forecast compares with \$249,841,960 actually spent on new hotel construction in 1930," says President A. E. Dickinson.

"Included in this figure are transient and resort hotels, apartment hotels and fraternal clubs. It does not include boarding-houses, touring camps, auto camps and the like.

"Today there are 17,700 hotels in the United States. This is an average of 14.4 to 100,000 people. Reports from more than 10,000 hotels show a total of 994,863 guest rooms, with an average of 83.6 rooms to each hotel."

### Mundelein Woman Backs Car Upon Her Own Child

Hearing a scream as she backed her car from the garage last week, Mrs. Will Ray of Mundelein stopped the car and investigated.

She found her two-year-old son, Teddy, lying beneath the machine. A rear wheel had rolled across his leg, breaking it, and had she not stopped the car at once, the front wheel would have crushed the life from his small body.
