This event has developed from a somewhat local affair in the first instance, with 45 entries, into an event in which the best known golfers of golfdom have made their appearance at one or the other occasion.

It is hoped that our local residents will avail themselves of this unusual exhibition of golf provided by the best talent in the country at this time.
