

PROBLEMS FACING ADMINISTRATION

Some of the Questions Which City Council Is Considering; Details

The problem of establishing a comprehensive system of through streets is being considered by the Highland Park city council. The cost of installing signs and traffic signals may be a stumbling block, it was indicated by Mayor E. B. Metzger.

A petition has been presented to the council for erection of stop signs on Sheridan road, at Roger Williams avenue, Ravinia. It is contended that residents of the district have difficulty getting through traffic to reach the bathing beach.

Plan Safety Lights

It was suggested that Roger Williams be made a through street, or at least that warning signs be erected as a protection to school children living in the vicinity. The school grounds are used during the summer as a community playground.

The petition revived demands for other stop signs installations. Several were along Green Bay road, others in the business district.

The best type of signs will be discussed. Stop sign, activated vehicle signals and regulation traffic signals have been urged. Condition of the city's ordinances, together with the economy platform of the administration, may, however, defer immediate action.

Skokie Ditch

Another problem presented for council consideration this week is the city liability, if any, for overflow of the Skokie ditch. Members of the Bob-o'-Link Golf club protested the conditions. Sunset Valley, the municipal course, also suffers following heavy rains.

It was reported that the ditch is under control of the East Skokie drainage district. The problem will be studied by the council.

Will Co-operate

Objection to loud and prolonged sounding of train signals on the west branch of the North Western railroad was voiced by C. N. Kimball. Investigation revealed that within the city all but one "whistle post" on the road had been removed, and that the road had agreed to abolish this signal.

Co-operation with the city of Evanston in its accident prevention week program was urged by the council. All North Shore motorists passing through Evanston are entitled to a free test of their brakes, lights, horns, etc., by the police of that city.
