## Cinema Talk

### New Revelation of Bow Talents Revealed

Convinced that the sparkling personality displayed by Clara Bow in her long screen career as America's favorite flapper had deprived the motion picture public of the deeper talents of that popular actress, Paramount executives have planned a long-series of emotional roles for the redheaded actress. Her first dramatic part in "Kick In," hailed as a new revelation of Bow talents, marks her debut in serious drama.

"Kick In," was adapted for the talking screen from the famous Willard Mack stage success of the same name. In it, the "It" girl has an exacting role which tests her capacity for emotional portrayal to an unusual degree. In love with an convict hounded by the police, Miss Bow is called upon to portray a character whose feelings range over the emotional spectrum with lightning-like rapidity.

The supporting cast, as well as the story, of "Kick In" was selected with great care to give Miss Bow every possible advantage in her first dramatic part. Regis Toomey, recently seen in George Bancroft's "Scandal Sheet," has the leading male role, a role which, for the first time on the talking screen, gives him a chance to match his superb performance in "Alibi," his first sensational success.

Wynne Gibson, the sceptical wife of Jack Oakie's recent comedy, "June Moon"; Leslie Fenton, Donald Crisp and Paul Hurst are also in the cast. Richard Wallace, whose work with Ruth Chatterton in "The Right to Love" created a cinema sensation recently, directed Clara Bow in "Kick In." Wallace is one of Hollywood's outstanding dramatic directors, his productions including "The Shopworn Angel" and the William Powell picture, "Man of the World."

### Mr. Lemon of Orange Is Gangster Satire

What is described as one of the funniest comedies of the year, is "Mr. Lemon Of Orange," in which El Brendel and Fifi Dorsay are co-starred. In this picture Brendel plays two roles. One is that of "Mr. Lemon," an inoffensive Swedish toy salesman, and the other is "Silent McGee," hard-boiled gangster chieftain.

The fun really starts when "Mr. Lemon," who resembles "McGee," is mistaken for the gang leader just after a truckload of liquor is hijacked and one of the gangsters is killed.

Fifi enters the plot at this point, determined on revenging her brother, the slain man. She invites "Mr. Lemon" to visit the night club where she sings, thinking he is "McGee." When he gets there gangsters try their best to put him "on the spot." How Brendel outwits the crooks and finally accomplishes the capture of both gangs affords hilarious entertainment.

The other principals in the cast include William Collier, Sr., Ruth Warren, Donald Dillaway and Joan Castle. John G. Blystone directed.

### Sensational Stage Success on Screen

"Young Sinners" was a sensational success on the stage, but on the screen, it is even greater. The production is a credit to Fox Films, to John Blystone, who directed it and to the cast of popular actors that people it.

Chief interest in "Young Sinners" centers about Thomas Meighan, the celebrated star, who, following two years of retirement, returns to the screen to portray the featured role of the rollicking Irish trainer who, by almost brutal force regenerates the body and soul of the headstrong and spendthrift son of a millionaire. The role is a perfect fit for Meighan and he gives a notable performance.

Hardie Albright, who, with Dorothy Jordan, furnishes the romantic interest, proves himself a real find. He gives a spirited and intelligent interpretation of his role and the vicious Miss Jordan, as always, takes every advantage of the opportunity to satisfy demands.

Other fine performances are given by Cecilia Loftus, as the girl's mother, James Kirkwood, as the boy's father, and Edmund Breese as the attorney. "Young Sinners" is a picture that all fathers and sons, mothers and daughters should see. They will be entertained and at the same time, may derive a beneficial lesson.
