#### Public Service Co. to Get Mammoth Forging

The largest single forging ever made in the United States, a giant generator rotor, is at present undergoing rigid tests at the manufacturer's plant before being shipped to Waukegan to be used in the 115,000 kilowatt turbo-generating unit now under construction at the Public Service plant on the north flats, north of Waukegan. The generator, of which the rotor is the rotating part, will be the largest single winding unit ever made.

Preliminary construction at the plant, preparatory to installing the generators, has been under way for some months and is about completed. Power is expected to be generated in the new unit by September or Octo-
