

### Highland Park May Adopt Safety Plan Started at Evanston

The "safety lane" adopted recently by Evanston traffic police, may be instituted in Highland Park before long, according to H. F. Kelley, vice president of the Highland Park Chamber of Commerce.

A committee has been appointed by the Chamber composed of A. G. Klemp, Paul L. Udell and Henry Siljestrom to study the operation of the safety plan in Evanston, and to make recommendations as to its adoption. Data collected will be submitted to Chief Ed Moroney of the Highland Park police department.

The "safety lane" is made up of a section of road on which automobiles are tested for angle of headlights, tone of horn, the windshield wiper, all brakes, angle of front wheels, and other details which contribute to safe driving and clear vision.

Tests have revealed that a very small percentage of automobiles passing down the safety lane pass the examination the first time. However, as motorists become used to the innovation, and keep their car in repair, more and more are checked as "o.k."

An introduction of a driver's school at Highland Park has also been discussed. Pupils would have to pass an examination before being allowed to drive in public.

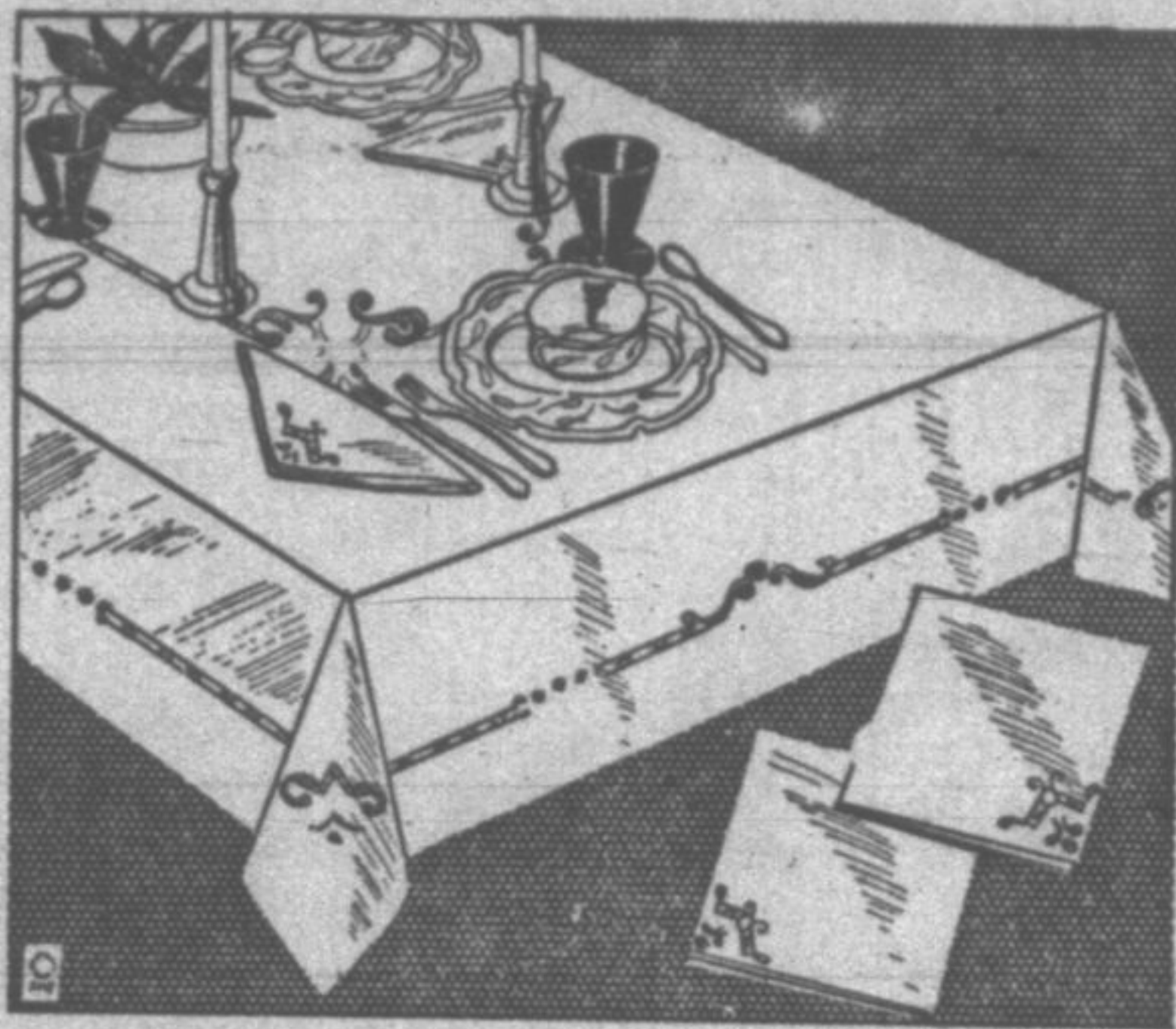

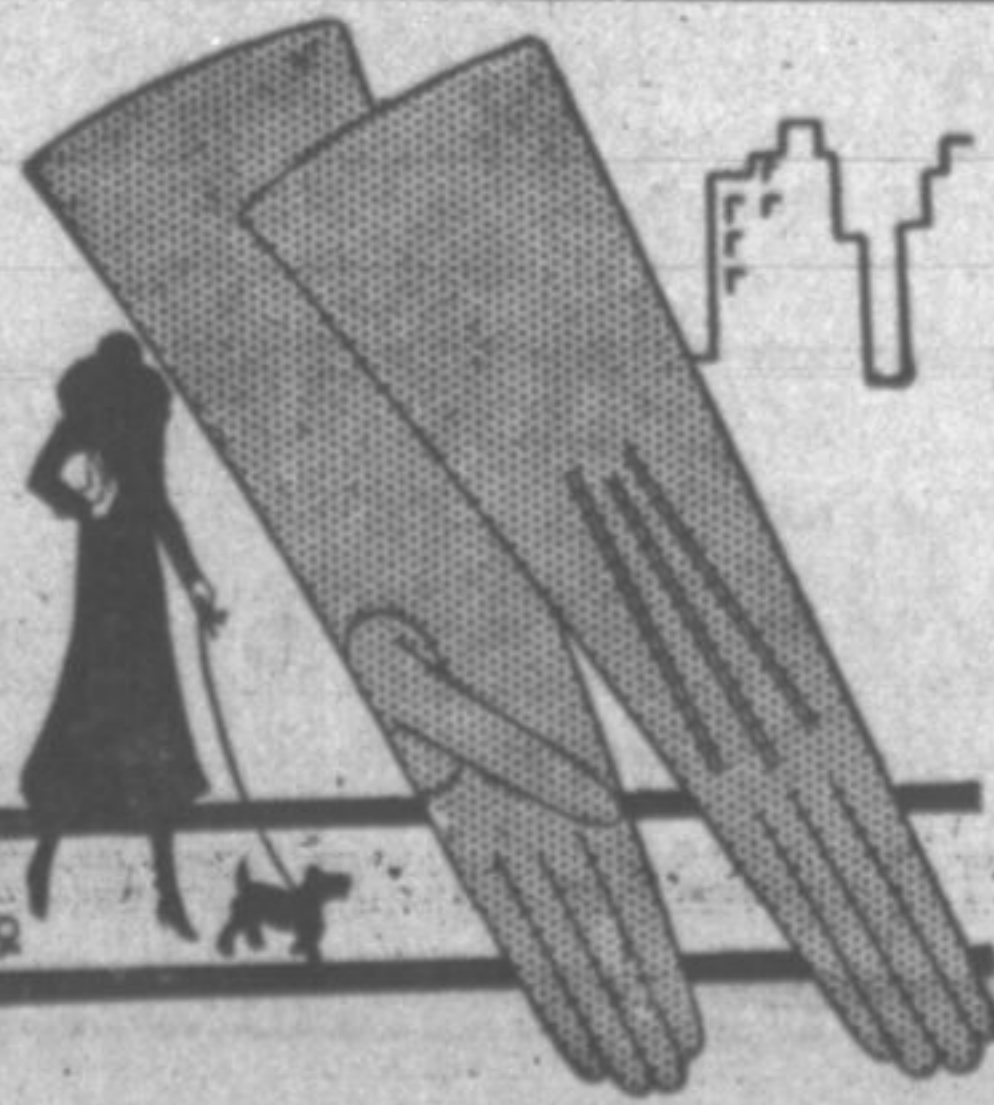
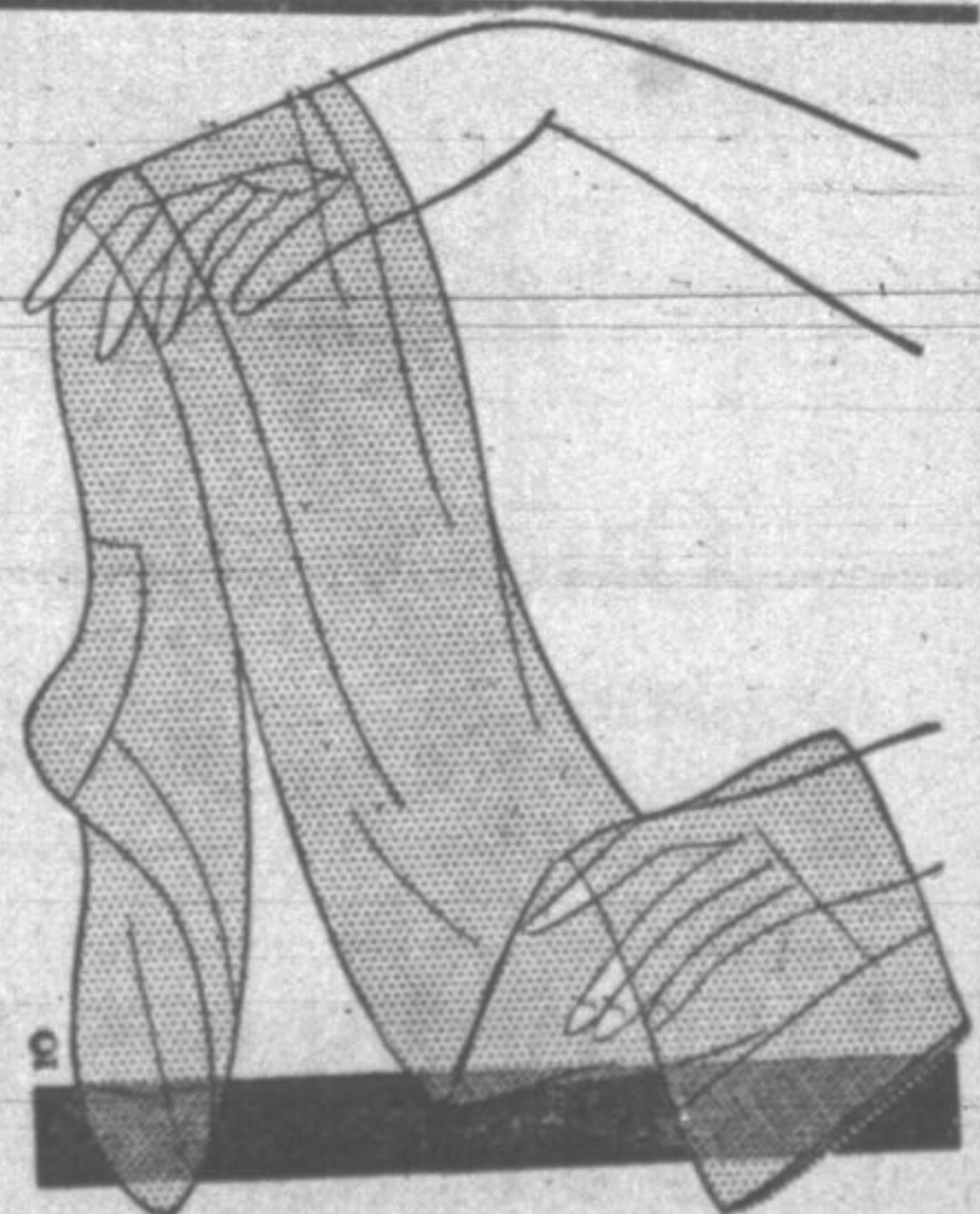
