The treasurer of the county, reported Brad West, had held up the payment of \$2,000 authorized Legion relief work under the Bogardus act because he was in doubt as to his duty. A legal ruling in the matter had been asked in the matter and until that had been rendered, Brad stated that his only hope was to continue such urgent relief as was necessary on a "charge" basis. If the fund was made available the bills would be paid, if not, then the individual posts might be expected to cover their own relief work.


