Mr. Hirsch states that the entire personnel, factory, distribution and service facilities of the Winslow organization will be kept intact.

The election of Mr. Hirsch as president of Kleen Heet, Inc., in addition to his direction of the Automatic Burner Corporation, manufacturers of famous ABC oil burner, in of marked importance to the oil burner industry.

Together the two concerns represent the third largest manufacturers of domestic heating oil burners in the United States, with assets of a million dollars and with licensed dealers in 890 communities. Both companies have been pioneers in the oil burner industry. Kleen Heet burners were first manufactured 13 years ago under the leadership of the late Willes S. Rehm, while ABC oil burners have been on the market since 1920.
