

Saturday Evening Post Advances Date of Its Weekly Delivery; Cause

The Saturday Evening Post is the champion weekly in its class in all our big round world. For 33 years the Post has appeared regularly every Thursday morning, not only in the U. S. A., but throughout Canada and many foreign countries. When the issue day was decided on in 1898 the publishers had in mind that by making the magazine available three days before Sunday, its contents, including its advertising, would be pretty well examined before Saturday-that day being the universal pay day as well as the family shopping day.

Now every day is shopping day, and pay day no longer rules our reading day. So, as many conditions have changed in the last third of a century, the Post has made a change to keep step with the timer, by fixing Tuesday as its issue day. The release days of other Curtis publications have also been set forward in the month, and the Ladies' Home Journal will be released on the second Friday and The Country Gentleman on the third Tuesday preceding the month of issue.

These changes, an announcement by the publishers states, are made at a time when the circulation of its magazines are at the highest points in the distribution of the magazines, here and abroad.

The publishing world is giving considerable notice to the action of the Saturday Evening Post, whose executives explain that the change to Tuesday will give two extra reading days in the week of issue.

If several thousand other Thursday weeklies in the United States should follow the example of the Post our great national salute would likely be changed from "nice day" to "what day is it?"

Illinois Products on Display Again at State Fair This Year Is Plan

Announcement has been made that the second annual Illinois Products Exposition will be held in conjunction with the Illinois State Fair, Aug. 22, 29. This products show, this year, will be more selective and less extensive than in 1930. It will present a cross-section of the state's production in the exposition hall beneath the grandstand. Booths are available at nominal prices, to early applicants. Geo. C. Wharton, secretary, 445-30 N. LaSalle street, Chicago, will allot space reservations in the order applications are received. In show parlance, the exposition will "get a bigger play" this year, because the crowd converges at the grandstand. Greater interest in the exhibition is in evidence, the secretary asserts, because the fair's entertainment program is more attractive.
