Sam Brown Belts for Crossing Watchman Is N.W. Safety Drive Plan

A concentrated drive to cut highway crossing accidents to a minimum, an outstanding feature of which is the placing of red and white "Sam Brown" belts on crossing watchmen, has just been launched by the Chicago and North Western railway under the direction of G. B. Vilas, general manager of the road. "This new drive follows a program of safety education among our em-

ployes extending over a period of years that was so effective as to enable us to win the 1930 Safety Award in Class A of the Steam Railroads Accident prevention contest for low rate of casualties (killed and injured) among our employes, and to improve that record more than 60 per cent during the first six months of this year. This work will go on with the same intensity, but in addition the effort has been extended to cut accidents at crossings and to trespassers by a series of forceful appeals for public cooperation," Mr. Vilas declared.
