These table classes will be scored as follows: 30 for originality; 30 for suitability and harmony of flower arrangement, and 40 for effectiveness.

Grown by Exhibitor

All flowers entered must have been grown by the exhibitor, except those in the classes for the plan stands and the card tables.

An exhibitor may make as many as three entries in any one class provided they be of different varieties and of course he may enter as many classes as he chooses.

Schedules and entry blanks may be obtained from Mrs. Dwight H. Davis, 1013 Wade street (H. P. 1791). They must be filled out and returned to her by Wednesday, August 12 in order that proper space may be assigned to each entry.

Depends on Exhibitors

Requests for blanks have already been received from Chicago and neighboring suburbs. Everyone who grows flowers is urged to enter, even if in only a few classes. The members of the club have worked and are working diligently to make the show as complete as possible and as smooth and frictionless in its operation as may be, but after all the real success of any show depends in large part upon its exhibitors. The persons who enter flowers help the show, the ones to simply say "Oh, I don't think much of those zinnias — I've much larger ones at home" are no help. Had the zinnias been entered they would either

have proved to be really finer and show, in the close comparison that have won the prize, or they would their remembered size or fine color were not really better at all. In either case they would have helped the show, and their grower would have proved a better "sportsman" then by sitting by and lauding the flowers that were not produced to prove their worth.

Bank Liquidation Is Proceeding Normally

Orderly liquidation of the asset of state banks in Chicago and its suburbs, including the Waukegan State bank, is going ahead as rapidly as possible, Oscar Nelson, state auditor, said last week. Bank securities are being handled in such a manner as to allow depositors to receive maximum returns on their deposits.

"We are doing everything we can to speed up the liquidation and to conserve the assets of the depositors, who are closely safeguarded by the law," he said. "It is true that a certain time must elapse before a receiver can make any disbursement to depositors.

"Twelve weeks are allowed the depositors to file their claims. They can, of course, file claims later than that."

The cost of receiverships in closed banks are not excessive, he added, and are rarely more than 7 per cent of the bank's assets, and the return to depositors in the majority of cases will be nearly 100 cents on the dollar.

Two empty cartridge shells were found in the yard.

Hoffman had abandoned his car and beer when the men accosted him, and from all indications he tried flight but was overtaken. Bullets punctured the body in three places.

The slain brewer then was taken across the Cook county line into Lake county and tossed into a cornfield. His wife reported his absence to highway police at the time.

The body was noticed Friday morning by Roman Kaupp, 16, and Clarence Weidner, 17, to Half Day youths. They saw the body about 6:30 o'clock in the morning and thought the man was sleeping. When they returned at noon and the body was still there they notified Deputy Sheriff Peter Praesel, of Half Day.
