**Federal Prisoners in County Jail Reported**

There were 35 federal prisoners booked by Sheriff Lester Tiffany in the Lake county jail during the quarter ending July 1, who served their full sentences, according to the expense vouchers being forwarded to the United States marshal by Chief Deputy Sheriff Thomas E. Kennedy. At present there are 41 federal prisoners in the jail and 38 county and municipal offenders, including those serving sentence of 10 days to one year.

Federal authorities have notified the sheriff's office that a contingent of 25 prisoners, sentenced for Volstead act violation and other charges, would be committed to the county jail this week.

**Bannockburn School Under Construction; Libertyville Contr.**
