Mr. Heroux, it developed, had gone to the aid of his wife who had been seized with a sudden cramp, but he was too exhausted by the time he reached her to be of any help.

Lorraine, realizing their plight, swam-rapidly to the couple and threw the man an 'nated rubber tire which she had been using to float with, while she attempted to grasp his wife. The latter clung so desperately to Lorraine that both went down, The Girl Scout repeatedly broke the woman's hold, but Mrs. Heroux' frantic struggles were defeating Lorraine's efforts, so that she was forced to shout to the shore for help. Other swimmers fortunately heard her cry, and a

life boat was sent to her aid. Physicians worked over Mrs. Heroux for 25 minutes before consciousness was restored, after which she was hurried to a hospital.

Mr. Heroux, in gratefully thanking Lorraine, assured her that both he and his wife would have been drowned but for her timely
