

### Fifty Pounds of High Explosive Tumbles to Street Without Blast

Fifty pounds of dynamite, enough to blast away a large part of the business district and shatter glass windows throughout the city, dropped from a truck last week in Waukegan, and fell harmlessly to the pavement in front of the Genesee theatre on North Genesee street. The truck driver, ignorant of the loss from his

cargo, did not stop.

Scores of pedestrians and motorists saw the white box fall from the truck and strike the ground heavily. Several, thinking of the driver's discomfort when he missed the package, laughed. None suspected that the box lying in the center of the street contained enough concentrated explosive to rip out the paving, shatter building walls, and destroy hundreds of lives.

Only one of the onlookers strolled

into the street. He was William R. Meyer, a carpenter of 835 Low avenue. As he walked close to the box, he saw the lettering, "Dynamite—High Explosive," on it side, and hurriedly called Motorcycle Officer Ben True. The two men gingerly picked up the dynamite and carried it to the police headquarters.

There it was learned that the dynamite was consigned to the Pipkorn Wallen company of Wauwatosa, Wis. It was being shipped from Chicago by truck.

### Fall to Serve Time in Prison He Helped Build in New Mexico, Report

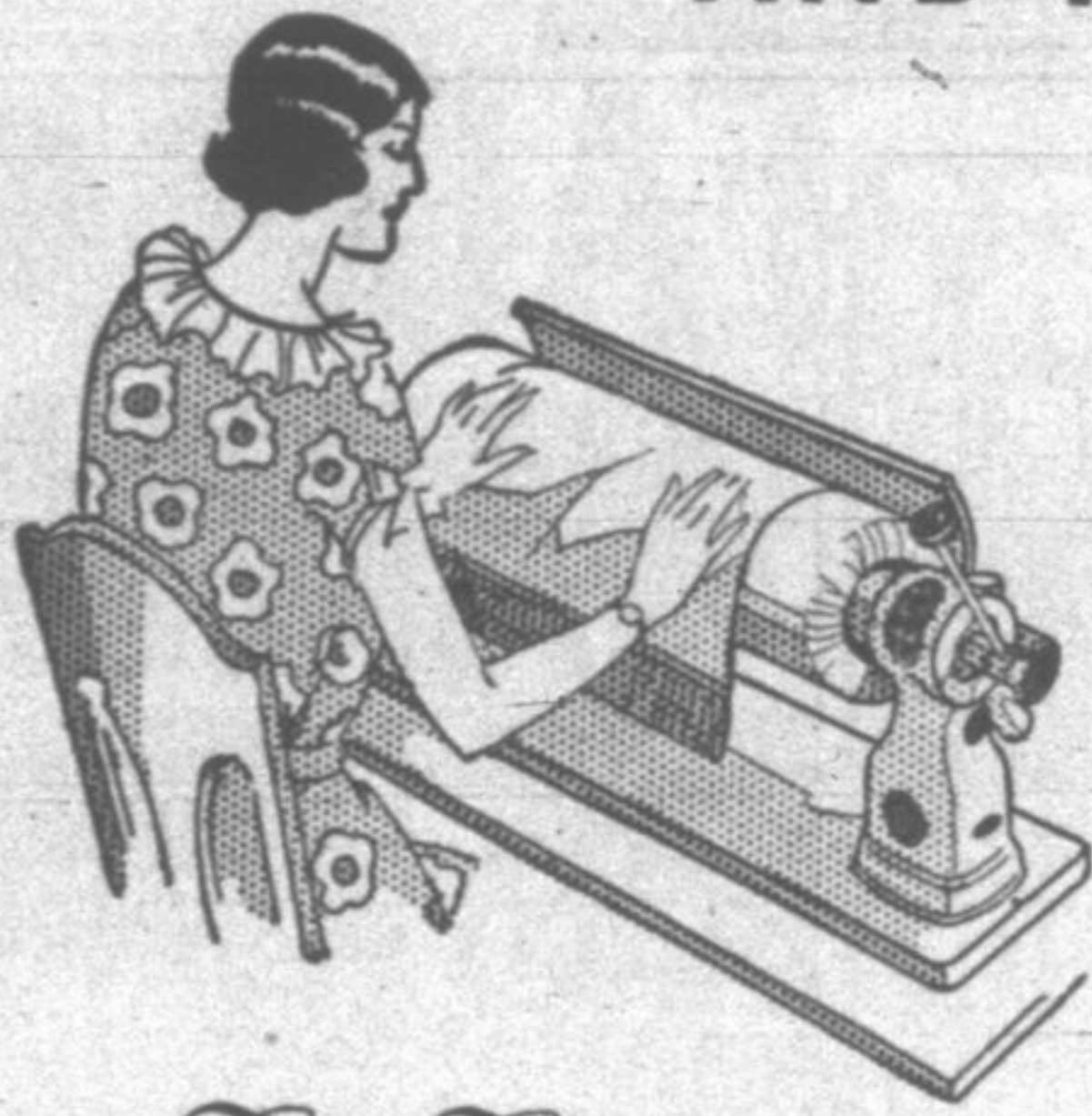
By a curious stroke of ironic fate, Albert B. Fall, former secretary of the interior, and convicted of accepting a \$100,000 bribe from Edward L. Doheney, will serve his long-delayed sentence of a year and a day in a penitentiary which he helped to create and whose problems engaged his political attention before he entered the cabinet of President Harding.

The New Mexico state prison on the outskirts of this city at the foothills of the Sangre de Cristo mountain range, built to accommodate 350 convicts, but now housing more than 500 men and women, awaits its most conspicuous prisoner since the grim, gray walls were erected in the Territorial days of 1884.

The drab stone administration unit is flanked by two gray stone cell houses, on each side of which and to the rear range 30-foot turreted walls forming a huge rectangle. But the celebrated inmate of this generally forbidding looking prison will not fare like his mates. The former cabinet member, because of his ill health, probably will be confined to a ward in the new hospital, completed a little more than a year ago by convict labor.

The transfer from his palatial home in El Paso, Texas, to within the towering walls of state's prison will not be as great a shock as it might be, however. The new hospital ward is a well-lighted, well-ventilated two-story brick building equipped with modern surgical and dental facilities and has an especially constructed unit for victims of tuberculosis from which Fall suffers.

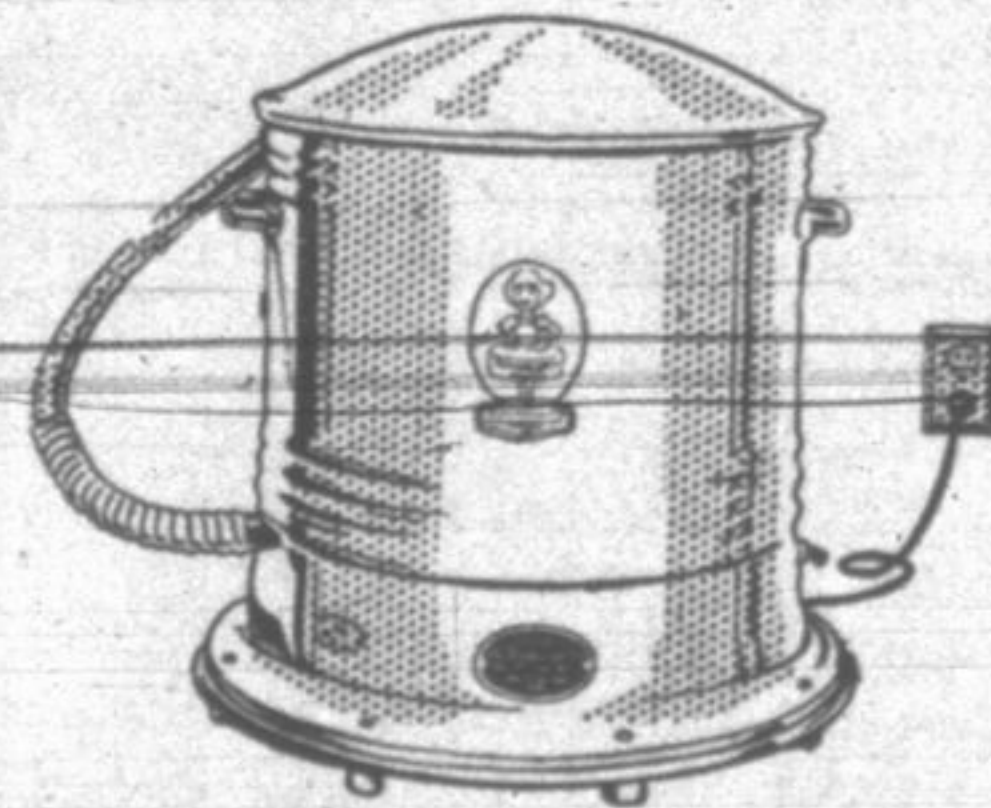
