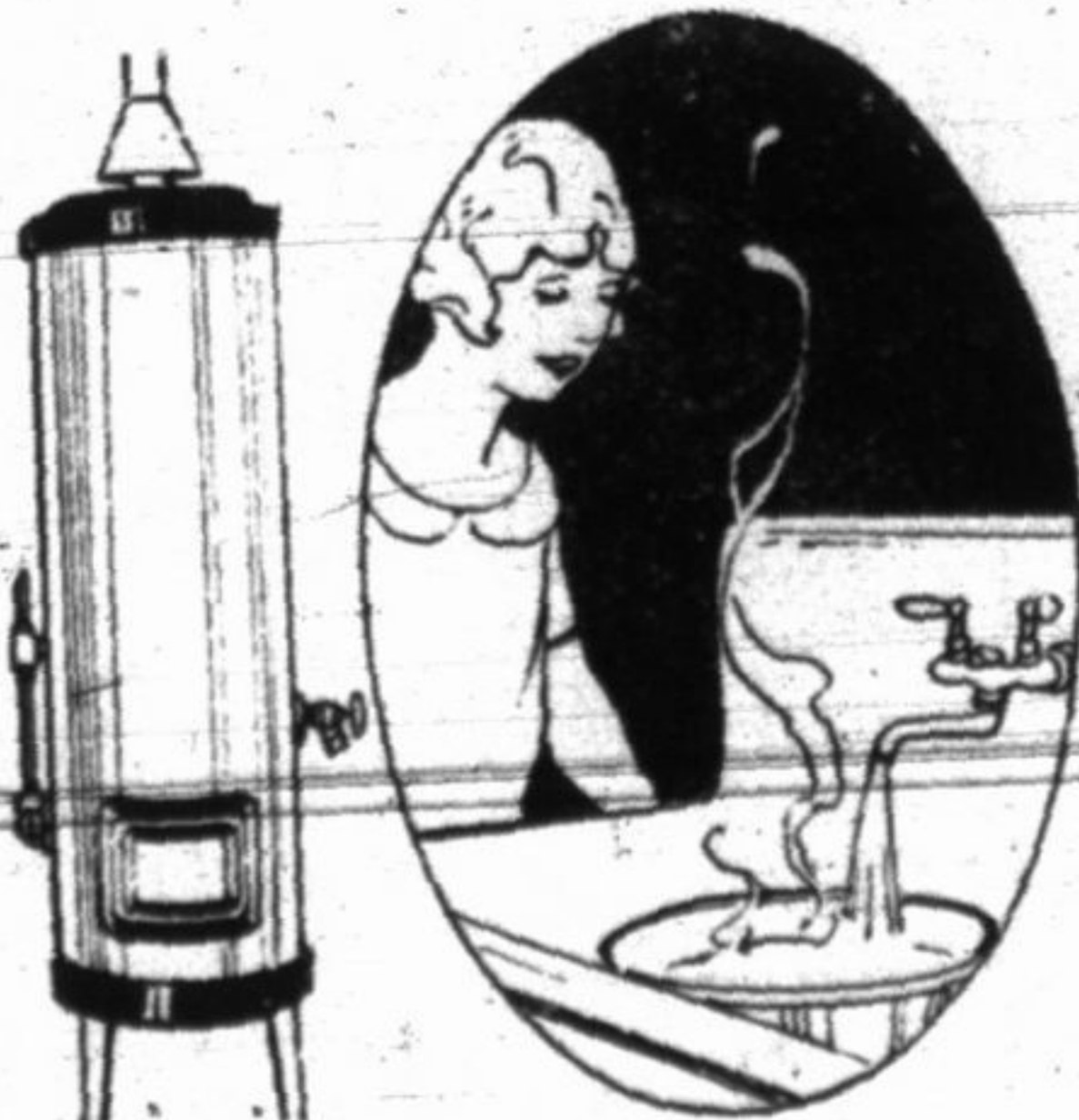

These Auto Drivers Have Stunt Akin to That of Tree Sitters

Having completed 1,056 hours of continuous occupancy of an automobile, a streak which started on July 11, Roy Johnson and Carl Anderson, both of Chicago, stopped off in Waukegan last week for a few minutes while on their way to Milwaukee for a short visit.

Away back on July 11, Carl and Roy crawled into a 1924 model automobile, which had been equipped for a long siege. After they had entered the sedan, others screwed wire netting over the side windows, and padlocked the doors. The starter had been disconnected, and the boys were off to win a bet that they could remain in the car for fifty hours without killing the motor.

The 50 hours were up and the men still fresh. They set out to crack the world's record for continuous occupancy of an automobile of 456 hours. The record was theirs at 11 o'clock on the afternoon of July 30. Then they set a goal of 1,000 hours.

The men were in Evanston when they passed the 900th hour of their self-imprisonment. For more than five weeks their engine had purred incessantly. The two have been driving and driving but getting nowhere. Even an attack of ptomaine poisoning, which laid Carl low and forced Roy to spend thirty-two hours at the wheel in one stretch failed to deter the marathon drivers.

At 11 o'clock last Saturday the men were to secure their release. Each has grown a shaggy beard. Neither has been on his feet for more than a month. Temperatures of 135 degrees have not been uncommon in the ancient sedan.

Lake County Farms Win Honors at the Central States Fair

In the open class, Lloyd Atwell of Lake Villa, won second with his Guernsey yearling.

Lake County Farm bureau won first place on an agricultural educational booth made up by H. C. Glickerson, farm advisor. This exhibit showed how dairying can reduce dairy costs by better feeding, through attending dairy feeding schools and learning how to balance their own rations.

The winnings of the Lake county 4-H Dairy club boys were numerous.
