## "A Free Soul" One of Year's Best Pictures

Audiences have seen Norma Shearer as a glittering society bud; they have seen her as a brilliant sophisticate. But in "A Free Soul" in which she plays the sensational heroine of the Adela Rogers St. Johns novel, audiences see a literally new Norma Shearer.

In the new Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer picture, she is fully as alluring as in "The Divorcee," as charmingly sophisticated as in "Strangers May Kiss," but there is added a new element. For never in her career has she played such a dramatic role as in this romance of San Francisco.

The conflict of the plot is twofold, relating to the love of the heroine for two vastly different men, a gambler and a society sportsman, and her equally binding devotion to a brilliant but habitually intoxicated father. The father has raised the girl with ideas of ultra-freedom but when he catches her in the arms of the notorious gambler he realizes that he has been his daughter's worst enemy.

In an attempt to save her from what he knows will be an unhappy alliance he promises to give up drinking. The events which follow make up a story which never lags for a moment and has enough suspense and action for two pictures.

The work of the supporting cast is uniformly excellent. While the film is first and foremost Miss Shearer's triumph, the next honors go to Lionel Barrymore. As the father who taught his child the wrong theories of life and on realization bares his own sins in court to save his daughter's happiness, he is a dominant and unforgettable figure.

Splendid work is also done by Leslie Howard and Clark Gable in the respective roles of the society sportsman and the gambler, and by James Gleason, the comic bodyguard, and Lucy Beaumont, the snobbish grandmother.

Clarence Brown's direction is deft, artistic and always to the point.
