Investigation revealed that the monkey had escaped from the nearby home of John Hayke, who kept the monkey as a pet.

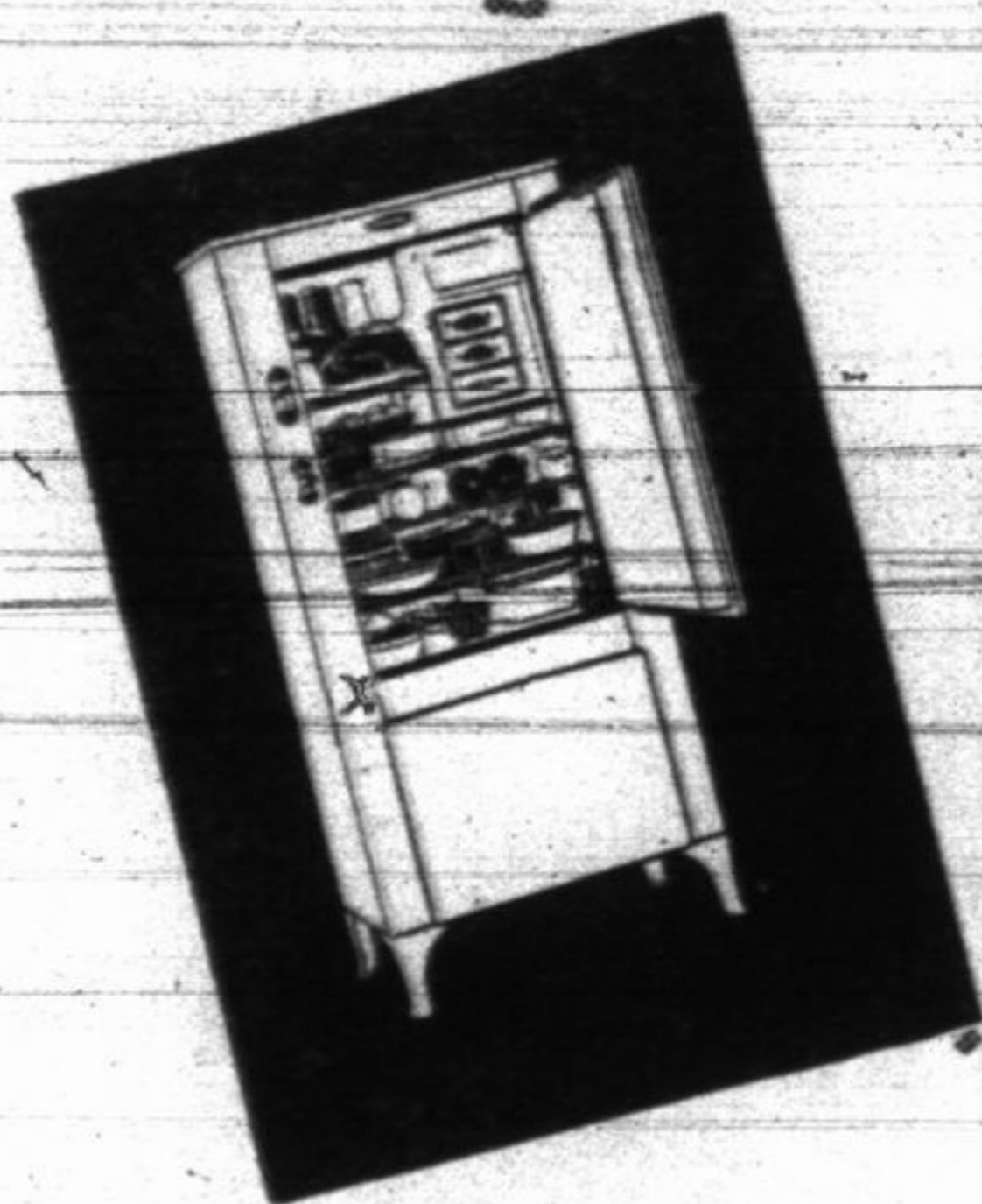
