CHILDREN'S FILMS AT FIELD MUSEUM

Eleven Free Programs on Variety of Subjects Offered on Saturday Mornings

Eleven free programs of motion pictures for children, presented under the provisions of the James Nelson and Anna Louise Raymond Foundation for Public School and Children's Lectures, will be given this autumn, beginning September 26, at Field Museum of Natural History, it was announced today.

A wide variety of subjects will be included among the thirty-seven films to be shown, including important events in American history, life among the American Indians, wild and domestic animals, travel in far parts of the earth, and many other topics.

On Successive Saturdays

These entertainments will be given on successive Saturday mornings in September, October, November and December, in the James Simpson theatre of the museum, and each will be presented twice, at 10 a.m. and 11 a.m., thus enabling the accommodation of several thousand children each week. Stephen C. Simms, director of the museum, invites children from all parts of Chicago and suburbs to attend. They may come alone, in groups from schools or other centers, or with their parents, teachers or other adults. No tickets are necessary for admission.

Government to Repair Waukegan Post Office

Extensive repairs that are to be made at once on the old Waukegan postoffice building raised some doubt as to whether or not this is to be taken as an indication that further delays are to occur in the starting of work on the proposed new \$337,000 federal building at Genesee and Julian streets.

An inspector from Washington spent two days in preparing specifications for contemplated repairs on the present building. These provide

for repairs to the roof, which long has been in a leaky condition, for painting of all screens and iron grillwork, for varnishing of all outside wood work and for the placing of sheetiron on the rear door.

No Radio Station at Waukegan; Plan Dead

There will be no 35 watt radio station in Waukegan as part of the nationwide radio communications system proposed by C. R. Cummins, Williamsport, Pa. About 20 other Illinois sta-

tions were proposed, according to a Washington dispatch to the Waukegan Times.

The radio commission has just killed the plan. It dismissed Cummins' application for 25 channels to be set aside for the exclusive use of local or community broadcasting stations. The application listed 267 cities and towns in which Cummins said he would erect stations.

The commission dismissed the application because Cummins failed to put in a personal appearance to back up his plans which would require the expenditure of millions of dollars.
