## TO TOTAL HUGE SUM

Awards to Be Made in August for Highway Pavement by State Augumented

To place the greatest possible amount of road work under contract in time for construction to get well underway before bad weather ends the season, Illinois highway officials last week added \$6,786,521 dollars worth of work to the August road bid-opening announced on July 27. Bids on the projects added today will be opened August 25.

This brings the total of road projects for which bids will be opened this month up to \$11,343,270 worth of work. Most of this, highway officials estimate, will go in wages to the men engaged directly and indirectly in the construction projects, scattered over 40 counties.

Hasten Proposals

To overcome delays incident to obtaining legal interpretations of the prevailing wage scale law enacted by the General Assembly, and the time it took to determine the prevailing rates of pay in 40 counties, the highway division officials have hastened this call for proposals so that awards on both lettings may be placed in August. Unless controversies arise regarding wage scales, the entire amount-upward of \$11,000,000 worth of work, will be awarded in time to relieve, to a marked degree, the present unemployment situation over a considerable portion of the state.

Further delays, the highway officials say, would endanger postponement of the work until the 1932 building season opens.

The two August lettings, as now scheduled, call for \$4,583,479 worth of work in the Chicago metropolitan area and \$6,760,791 worth of work in downstate counties.

Total of 194 Miles

The work involved includes a total of 194.48 miles of pavement and 82.90 miles of grading. In addition, there are 42 separate bridge sections. This includes many important grade separation projects, a number of bridge-widening jobs, and the general run of bridge and culvert work incident to road construction.

The prevailing hourly rates of wage for the 14 counties that were not listed in the preceding call for bids are classified into four groups.


