The Governor's proclamation fol lows:

"Fire waste is one of the most re grettable and unnecessary incident of our economic and social life.

"In the last fiscal year Illinois reguests at the P. corded 19,183 fires, with a loss \$21,815,989. This approximates burning rate of one fire every 2 day anniversary. minutes and a daily loss of \$59,770. "Deaths from fire in this State

numbered 379 in 1930.

"This tremendous waste of life and property is wholly unwarranted since authorities agree that 90 per cent of all fires and fire casualties an preventable by exercise of reasonable care and caution. It is a duty good citizenship to accept a personal responsibility in practicing habits of carefulness in all things which may cause fire.

"Now, Therefore, I, Louis L. En merson, Governor of the State of Ill nois, do hereby designate and proclaim the week from October 4 to October 10, 1931 to be observed i the State of Illinois as

Fire Prevention Week

"I urge the people of the State take occasion this week to make afternoon, thorough clean-up of fire hazards and unnecessary combustible material homes, places of business, factories schools, hospitals, places of assembly amusement and worship, and in all other classes of property. Particular care should be taken to see that heat ing equipment is in safe condition for winter.

"I suggest that mayor, fire chiefs Chambers of Commerce, civic organ izations, schools and the press co-operate in a practical program of fire prevention in their respective con munities, which should be carried systematically during the entire year


