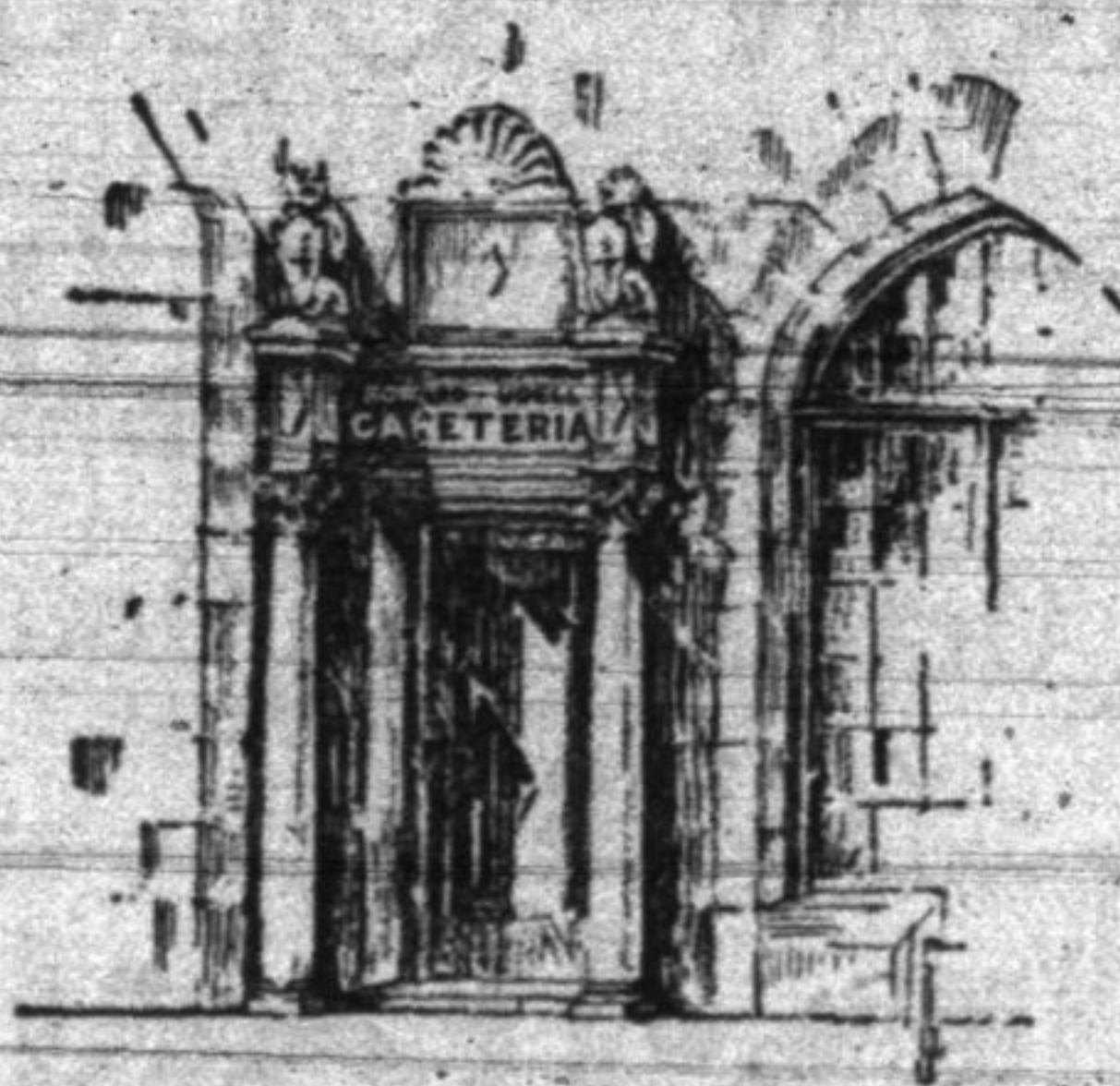

Chicago 1933 World's Fair

Some of the Chicago 1933 World's Fair may now be seen in the lobby of the library in pictures of the main buildings, some in the process of erection and others to be erected. The World's Columbian Exposition is also there in pictures and books which have been preserved in the library shelves for many years. This will be in place until Friday.

### Representatives Are Expected to Again Be Candidates for Office

The three representatives and one senator from the Eighth district all are expected to seek renomination next spring, according to leaders in both the Republican and Democratic ranks but opposition is expected in both party primaries.

State Senator Ray Paddock of Wauconda, has confided in friends, it is reported, that he will be a certain starter for the Republican nomination, and thus far, although several leaders have been suggested, not a single formidable candidate has appeared willing to contest for the honors with the senator.

Representatives Richard Lyons and William Carroll, Republicans, are expected to again enter the race, but this primary is likely to be complicated. Nick M. Keller, former city commissioner, is listening to the urging of his many friends, it is understood and seems ready to answer a call. Former Representative Lee McDonough may again seek the seat he lost in the last election to Rep. Thomas Bolger, Democrat, of McHenry.

Mr. Bolger is believed to have gained some strength since his election, but at least one candidate is expected to oppose him for the nomination, probably a Lake county man backed by the Lake County Democratic club.
