Six unmasked bandits last week held up, bound and robbed Mr. and Mrs. Fred Myers, proprietors of the Myers roadhouse near Camp Lake, of several thousand dollars in cash, jewelry valued at \$1,500, and their new Buick coupe.

Falling through an open hay chute preparatory to feeding the horses at the Tewes Ice company barn, 323 N. Sheridan road, Waukegan, William A. Guerin, 61-year-old stableman, was killed last week when his head struck the concrete flooring twelve feet below.

Entering the building through an unlocked basement window, burglars last week opened the safe in the Reginald B. Godfrey Dress Shop on Grayslake's Main street and stole \$35 in cash and a valuable watch.

Miss Frances Cady Oleson, daughter of John P. Oleson, president of the First National bank of Chicago, and Fred Floyd, junior clerk in the institution, were married in Waukegan last week. The elopement came as a surprise to parents on both sides, as the marriage was expected for some future date.

Announcement was made last week of plans for a meeting in Libertyville early in October to form an organization of township clerks and road commissioners. The organization would help co-ordinate poor relief and township highway works according to its sponsors.
