

Highwood Indians Defeat Northbrook Last Sunday, 19-0

The Indians won the toss and chose to defend the west goal with the wind to their backs. Northbrook received the kickoff but failed to make a first down and lost the

ball on their own 30-yard line. On the first play Cooney took the ball for a gain of 17 yards on an off-tackle play. A series of line smashes netted another first down but the Indians failed to score by the small margin of 1 foot and lost the ball at the point. Northbrook attempted a punt but this was blocked and recovered by J. Frantonus of the Indians for the first 6 points. Barruffi attempted the point after touch-down but failed.

In the next quarter the Indians managed to score two touchdowns against the wind and a forward pass to Credi counted for an extra point. The next half was an "0-to-0" affair; and as a result no scores were made by either.
